LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Shire of Yilgarn ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 27 August 2021

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 16 October 2021 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Yilgarn.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 27 August 2021. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Enrolment Forms

Electoral enrolment forms are available from the Shire of Yilgarn, all post offices, all Australian Electoral Commission offices or the Western Australian Electoral Commission and must be completed and reach a Divisional Returning Officer in Western Australia by 5:00 PM Friday, 27 August 2021.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Yilgarn and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are **not** on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Yilgarn you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Yilgarn prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Yilgarn to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 27 August 2021. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Yilgarn.





PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005 CLAUSE 6 PROPOSED PUBLIC WORKS - RESIDENTIAL

The Shire of Yilgarn is in receipt of a proposal, lodged on behalf of the Department of Communities – Housing branch, to develop and construct two (2) grouped dwellings at Lot 776 & 100 (No. 117) Altair Street, Southern Cross.

The Shire's current Town Planning Scheme zones the land R10, which does not allow for grouped dwellings of this nature ordinarily. However, as the proposed development is being undertaken by the Department of Communities, and is classed as "Public Works", the Planning and Development Act 2005 exempts this work from requiring Development Approval from the Shire. However, the Department must show due regard for the intentions of the Shire's Town Planning Scheme, and must undertake relevant public consultation of the proposed development.

As such, the Shire, on behalf of the Department, is seeking submissions on the proposal. A document detailing the proposal is available by contacting the Executive Manager Regulatory Services in person at the Shire Administration Office, or via Phone 9049 1001 or Email emrs@yilgarn.wa.gov.au with submissions excepted up until **12:00pm Thursday 19th August 2021.** The matter will also be tabled at the Shire of Yilgarn Ordinary Council meeting, to be held on the 19th August 2021.



<u>Dave Callan</u> is easily the hairiest comedian in Australia. He's a versatile and highly entertaining comedian, writer and performer, who is commonly mistaken for Chewbacca, Jesus and The Wild Man from Borneo.

ARE YOU A REGISTERED ORGAN DONOR?

2 August 2021

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies has urged West Australians to register as organ and tissue donors as part of DonateLife's *Great Registration Race* being held this July and August.

Ms Davies said DonateLife were aiming to sign up at least 100,000 more donors, helping to give critically ill or injured people a second chance at a healthy life.

"I am on the donor registration list already, but a conversation with a constituent about her experience prompted me to double check and then help advocate for more people to do the same," Ms Davies said.

"I learned that 9 in 10 Aussies support donation, but only one in 3 are registered.

"It's also a fact that many Australians think they are registered but they are not so the Great Registration Race is not only about encouraging more people to register but also about asking people to check their registration."

Ms Davies said a constituent, Chelsey Maloney from Merredin, had recently shared her own experience of being a donor and it prompted her to go and check her own registration.

"The next day I was online with my Medicare number checking my registration through the DonateLife website, it was quick and easy and I'm pleased to say I was already on the list," Ms Davies said.

Ms Maloney said there were about 7 million Australians registered as donors already, but there were about 13 million that were eligible but weren't.

"I thank my donor every day for giving me another chance at life, without him and his wonderful family I'd still be on dialysis or not here at all."

Ms Davies said the impact of COVID on organ and tissue donation had been significant, with a 16 percent decrease in the number of donors and a 12 percent decrease in the number of people receiving a transplant compared to 2019.

"I encourage everyone to have the conversation about donation with their family and registering to become a donor," she said.

According to DonateLife 1,270 Australian lives were saved through an organ transplant due to the generosity of 463 deceased organ donors and their families last year.

Around 1,800 Australians are on the waitlist for an organ transplant, and a further 12,000 are on dialysis, many of whom may benefit from a kidney transplant.



What does the Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service do?

Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service (VFRS) volunteers play a significant and vital role in helping to ensure their local communities are safe.

Volunteers carry out a range of activities including:

- Responding to local emergencies, such as:
 - structure fires:
 - bush and scrub fires;
 - vehicle and industrial rescue; and
 - hazardous materials emergencies.
- Working with the community to identify and manage local fire risk.
- Undertaking local fire prevention activities with the community.
- Educating school children in fire safety.
- Working with residents to improve family and household fire safety.

What volunteer roles are available?

Volunteers undertake various roles according to their abilities, interests, and what they are comfortable with. The different VFRS roles include:

- Firefighting (structural and bush fire)
- Community safety and education
- Administration
- Equipment maintenance
- Management of hazardous materials (HAZMAT)
- Road crash rescue

What will I be doing?

Time commitments vary between brigades but a typical range is:

- One training night per calendar month
- On average one weekend every two months
- Attend incidents when you are available.

Responsibilities include:

- Attending fires, road crash rescue and hazardous material incidents whenever possible.
- Following instructions given by the Captain, brigade officers and officer-in-charge.
- Using brigade's equipment and vehicles in a safe manner.
- Attending brigade meetings regularly.
- Participating in training and drills.
- Maintaining a reasonable level of fitness appropriate to the tasks allocated.
- Maintaining appliances, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE).


