Work from home, where possible

Close contacts with symptoms must continue to follow existing close contact requirements

Díd you know?

Did you know the original footie field in Southern Cross was where the town hall now stands? Cricket was also played there, a cycle track built around the perimeter, croquet played, and later a tennis court. Only tennis has survived, on the same site it started on. Other sports were relocated, the land needed for Council purposes.

The railway oval, now Constellation Park, was the next sports ground, then the Greater Sports Ground behind the caravan park, then back to railway oval, and finally to the present Recreation Ground in the early 1950's. It is interesting to note that history has taken a full circle, with the town hall block now home to the bowling club as well as tennis and the swimming pool. It was bituminising the main road (Canopus Street) during 1949 which led to sport returning to its roots.

Canopus was once a dual road, like most of early town. Only one half of the road was needed, the other half benefiting the school ground, the swimming pool, and the present football oval. The Fire Brigade also owes it present site to narrowing of Canopus Street. Separate lot numbers were created for these extended areas. For the record, lot 4 of 5 acres is where the school is. Lot 5 is the Shire block, and lot 6 the sporting reserve. Lot 5 has had a checkered history which I will outline another time.

If you answered YES to any of the above – collect a free pulse oximeter from the Southern Cross CRC today!

What is a pulse oximeter?

It is a small, peg-like device that clips onto your fingertip to read your heart rate and blood oxygen level. It takes only one minute to work, is reusable and can be shared between other people in your household.

Why do I need one?

If you become COVID-19 positive, you may need to be remotely monitored through the WA COVID Care at Home program. By having a pulse oximeter already in your home, a health professional can assess you and provide health advice from the comfort of your home.

Visit WA COVID Care at Home for more information.

Where do I get one?

Visit the CRC to collect a free pulse oximeter for you and your household (each eligible household can receive one pulse oximeter but supplies are limited).

Do **not** pick up a pulse oximeter if you are already COVID-19 positive. If you have already received a positive COVID-19 test result, the Department of Health will contact you and provide further information.

WHEATBELT REVEGETATION PROGRAM LAND PURCHASES

Main Roads is seeking to buy portions of land adjacent to State roads for revegetation purposes. There are a number of upgrades planned for roads, particularly within the Wheatbelt and to a lesser extent, Great Southern regions of WA, which will require the removal of native vegetation that, in some cases, is protected by both State and Commonwealth legislation. The purpose of the land acquisitions and revegetation is to "offset" the future residual loss of this vegetation.

Main Roads is ideally looking for cleared farming land immediately adjoining the road reserves of State roads. The land should be 50 to 100 metres wide and more than one kilometre long and (preferably) linking remnant vegetation. It is intended that any land acquired would be dedicated as road reserve.
