## SHIRE OF YILGARN

### **RURAL NUMBERING SYSTEM INTRODUCTION**

Council intends allocating funds in the 2019/2020 Budget to implement the Rural Numbering System for rural property owners in the Shire. This will enable the project to be completed in the first half of 2020.

The Rural Numbering System has been introduced in many Shires throughout the Wheatbelt and South West areas of the State and has been hailed as an important identifier of properties for first responders in emergency situations.

There will be some inconvenience to rural property owners once new property numbers have been allocated and the system is in place, mainly relating to change of address notifications to Telstra, Synergy and Water Corporation as these providers will not change addresses unless requested to do so by the account holder. Non-government organisations that the landholder privately deals with will also need to be advised of address changes when the Rural Numbering System is introduced.

Rural residents will be kept informed of the progress of this project and Council staff will work closely with residents to ensure a smooth transition takes place. Should rural residents wish to obtain further information regarding this project, please contact the undersigned on 90 491 001.

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## Grant opportunities

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### The Regional Athlete Travel Subsidy Scheme - Round 2 of 2018/19

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The Federal Government recently announced a \$3.5 billion Climate Solutions Package, which will make sure that we reach our climate targets, while maintaining a strong economy that delivers jobs and opportunities for the next generation.

The Climate Solutions Package will invest \$2 billion toward initiatives that reduce greenhouse emissions across the economy, giving Durack farmers, small businesses and indigenous communities, amongst others, the chance to improve the local environment.

The fund will support businesses and community groups to improve their energy efficiency, reduce emissions and lower their power bills.

It will help achieve cleaner and greener communities by supporting local community groups to deliver projects to protect and care for local environments.

There are three grants available to Durack constituents:

**[Energy Efficient Communities Program – Small Business Grants](https://www.energy.gov.au/sites/default/files/energy_efficient_communities_program_factsheet.pdf)** ([https://www.energy.gov.au/sites/default/files/energy\\_efficient\\_communities\\_program\\_factsheet.pdf](https://www.energy.gov.au/sites/default/files/energy_efficient_communities_program_factsheet.pdf)): This program is for small businesses throughout the electorate of Durack to apply for funding for up to \$25,000 to increase their energy efficiency, for example through the replacement of appliances or the installation of energy efficient systems.

**[Energy Efficient Communities Program – Solar Communities Grants](https://www.energy.gov.au/sites/default/files/energy_efficient_communities_program_factsheet.pdf)** (same link as above): This program is for community groups who wish to lower their electricity bills and increase their energy efficiency by installing solar and/or battery systems. The grant is capped at \$12,500.

**[Communities Environment Program](http://www.environment.gov.au/cep)**(<http://www.environment.gov.au/cep>): This program is for community groups who wish to undertake any project to benefit the environment and seek funding between \$500 and \$20,000. Examples could include a community garden, a recycling program, or a feral animal eradication program.

## Influenza Vaccination Program for 2019

Annual vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications.

We have been advised by the Department of Health WA that government funded influenza vaccines should be available sometime in April.

Please note: optimal protection against influenza occurs within the first three to four months following vaccination. Timing of vaccination should aim to achieve the highest level of protection during peak influenza season, usually from June to September in most parts of Australia. Therefore, vaccinating from April/May provides protection before the peak season (*Department of Health WA, March 2019*).

*Eligibility for government funded influenza vaccination will be advised in Crosswords and at the surgery once the vaccine is available.*

### Private influenza vaccinations:

We will be offering private flu vaccines for a small cost to those who do not meet the above criteria, and also for those companies who wish to have their employees vaccinated. Please contact the practice on 9049 1147 for appointment scheduling.

Fear Group President Callum Wesley kicked off the afternoon with updating the group on his deep ripping machine and trials. Followed by Clint Della Bosca presenting his results on the Morrell Lime Trial and deep ripping, finishing off the results for 2018 Peter Bird from GRDC presented the group with the state NVT trial results.

Benita Moir from Elders presented on the upcoming label changes for 2-4-d ester and provided a refresher on chemical uses for 2019 and reminding the growers of chemical residual carry over. Tanya Kilminster and Lucy Anderton from DPIRD presented the FarmSmart program that they are developing which will assist in on farm decision making as the seasons change.

We then broke for a cuppa and homemade goodies. After the break we had Norm Trethewey from AgriRisk Services presenting weather insurance and risk management. To lighten the afternoon David Mighall from AgVise presented about his recent trip to America and the farming lands and business he visited.

The last two speakers of the day where what everyone was most looking forward to starting with Danielle McNamee from ProcessWorx discussing with the group about HR and Safety compliance on Farms with what tools you need to ensure your business and employees are protected. he's outward looking, sprightly and hale, the type holds doors open for old dears.  
Long ago he was assisted to buy his unit by his beloved club,  
he'd love bowling again but years've gone by, old faces have disappeared, that's the rub.  
There's no woman in his life now, his wife died many years ago,  
no one close for a talk or row, he's a bit lost and time's a bit slow.  
His son lives far away in Queensland, never writes, probably too busy with his life,  
and his daughter, once his little right hand, left Australia years ago as a Yank's wife.  
His silky terrier died two years back that used to make him walk briskly about,

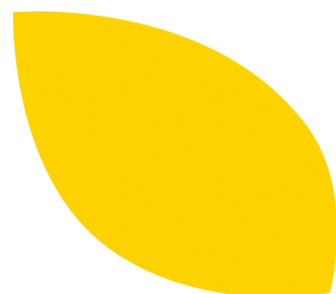

### **Make moving smooth sailing**

Moving house is an activity guaranteed to set the stress levels soaring, so it helps to know how to avoid potential nasty surprises when engaging the services of a furniture removalist.

Whether you're moving down the street or across the country, it is a time-consuming and often expensive exercise dreaded by most.

A moving 'to-do' list can seem endless. Not only do you need to find a new place to live, but also organise vacate cleaning, have services disconnected, redirect your mail and say goodbye to neighbours. Not to mention finding a trusted furniture removalist to move valuables including your furniture, sentimental items and household essentials.

The most common complaints Consumer Protection receives in relation to furniture removalists are about damage to consumers' property, delays in delivery and disagreements about quotes.

To make moving easier, we suggest talking to friends or family about their experiences and selecting a furniture removalist with good personal references.

To avoid paying too much, always get three written quotes to compare prices and the level of service provided.

When organising a quote, avoid estimating the volume of goods over the phone yourself, instead ask if the removalist can visit your home and view the goods in person.

The internet provides access to a range of services that will assist you to plan and arrange your move. Do your homework to help eliminate surprises. Don't forget to ask questions such as:

- What is included in the price and what is not, for example packing and unpacking, extra staff?
- Is insurance included? What does it cover and who pays for what in the event of damage or loss?
- If there is any delay, are there extra costs for overnight storage, and who pays for them?

We also recommend consumers compile a detailed inventory, including photographic or video evidence, of all items included in the move to guard against loss and damage.

Under the Australian Consumer Law, a removalist, like any other trader, is required to exercise due care and skill and deliver services within a reasonable time. As a general rule, no contract can remove a consumer's rights which, in this case, includes being able to claim compensation for loss/damage to goods.

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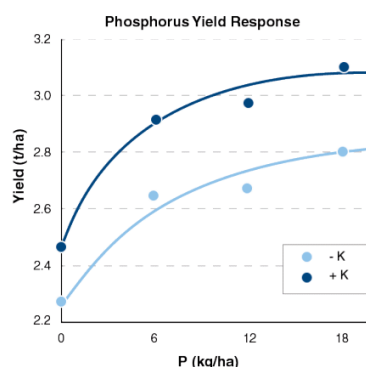
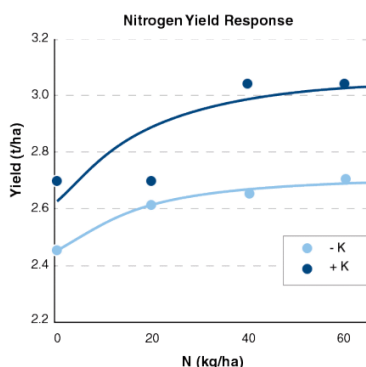

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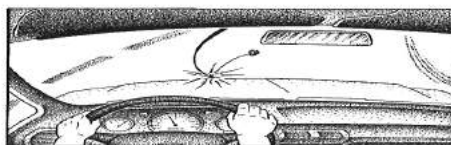
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## Pioneers of Yilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887  
and 1914

**Payne family:** Joe Payne with wife Pauline and seven daughters and one son arrived at Golden Valley in September 1894.

The family took over the Nugget Hotel and kept an ailing Golden Valley alive for the next 18 years. Joe was mad keen on horses and soon had Golden Valley Racing Club up and running.

Golden Valley social calendar was always full and parties attended by Southern Crossites lasted for days. Joe and son Billie operated a carrying business while the girls and Pauline ran the hotel.

The women also ran a pastoral lease where they did all the mustering and horse breaking. When the goldfields pipe reached Southern Cross in 1902, Joe made history by buying the first gallon of water.

During 1903 Pauline had one foot amputated but returned to Golden Valley to resume her chores. A few months later Joe was killed by a kick from a young horse he was breaking in.

The Nugget Hotel continued on with Pauline and her daughters running the show including the mail contract. Two daughters married Clamp brothers and two married Blennerhasset brothers.

In 1912 the hotel and pastoral lease were sold off and Pauline retired to Perth.
