TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

PUBLIC NOTICE ROAD UPGRADES UNDERWAY

Construction of the Parker Range Diversion Road and the Emu Fence Road Upgrade works will commence in late January 2021. The Parker Range Diversion Road is expected to be completed by early March 2021 and the Emu Fence Road works are expected to be completed by the end of April 2021. With the approval of the Shire of Yilgarn, a detour will be implemented between the Parker Range Road / Emu Fence Road intersection through to the Bennett Road / Emu Fence Road intersection for approximately one month effective early Feb to early March 2021.

Activity Notice Regional Airborne Survey

Geoscience Australia, in collaboration with The Geological Survey of Western Australia (GSWA), is carrying out an airborne electromagnetic (AEM) survey across the southern part of Western Australia during 2020 and 2021.

AEM surveys are widely used for groundwater mapping, as well as for mineral and energy resources exploration. This survey will provide regional data coverage for more informed natural resource management and better focussed exploration investment. The survey is funded via the Western Australian Government's Exploration Incentive Scheme.

AEM survey method

Aircraft fitted with electromagnetic instruments map variations in the electrical conductivity of the ground to a depth of several hundred metres without any ground disturbance.

What you may see




Figure 1.Map showing the survey area, airports, regional localities and flight lines of the AUSAEM 20 – WA - South West Survey.

A Helicopter, towing equipment below it, will make a single pass approximately 100 m above the ground, along tracks 20 km apart (see Figure 1 on reverse side of this notice). If you have any concerns with this activity, please make further enquiries via one of the contacts listed below.

Covid 19 Protocols

Geoscience Australia and Geological Survey of Western Australia are committed to maintaining a healthy and safe workplace. Our commitment to a consistent national approach includes clear and transparent communication, forming best practices in prevention, mitigation, and response to the risks presented by COVID 19. We ensure our contractors have: adequate cleaning solutions when using equipment, access to handwashing facilities, personal protective equipment and observe social distancing where possible. The survey will be conducted in accordance with relevant state and national restrictions regarding Covid-19. Staff or contractors will not enter any remote Aboriginal Communities. No ground disturbance will occur within the survey area.

Important to know

All data produced by Geoscience Australia and GSWA from this survey will be freely available after quality assurance checks have been performed.

Timeframes and work area

The survey will be flown from September to December 2020. Figure 1, on the reverse side of this notice shows the location of the survey. The area covers the Southwest of Western Australia including Esperance, Norseman, Bunbury, Albany and Corrigin. While the survey also includes the perimeters of Perth City, it will not cover urban areas.

Did You Know?

Did you know that Southern Cross held picture shows as far back as 1895? Esmay Gibbney recalls living in Southern Cross as a youngster. She remembers the first pictures were shown by a travelling show with a biograph – a machine set up in the aisle and projecting pictures from slides on to a screen on the stage.

It was silent pictures in those days with a pianist sitting on one side playing music appropriate to the scene being displayed. The venue was the Mechanics Institute hall, sited opposite the present two-story café.

About 1910 Mrs Hugh Murray showed moving and silent pictures once a week, and later it was taken over by Mrs Sprunt. In 1925 the business was sold to the Goodin family, who moved the pictures to their own hall alongside the Club Hotel.

In 1965, Goodin moved the picture screening to a drive-in theatre built on Constellations Park, on the north side of town. A year or two later, television reached Southern Cross, and the old time pictures became history.

THE LOCAL TOURIST GOES TO REMLAP STATION

It's been a while since we had a bush trip, and a few weeks ago an Invitation for a 70th birthday celebration was issued to us, at Remlap Station. Whooee! It's great to wander around in 2/3 biodiversity regions in one place. Salt Lakes, south rangelands and station country. There are sandplains, salt bush, salmon gum, gimlet, tea tree, mallee fowls, lots of birdlife, flies by the millions, granite rocks, breakaways an old shearing shed and homestead. Lots of ecosystems and historical sites for us to explore if the tracks weren't underwater. Curses!

We left home about 7.30, arrived in Beacon at about 10.30, met up with John Dunne, quite by chance (the owner of Remlap) and were given the gist on the tracks and where to go. Lucky we met up with a fabulous tour guide on Mitchell Road, who took us to the Salmon Gums Camp, where everyone was camping. Thank you Maureen and Terry.

John and Annie were already set up, as were the others attendees; John's cousins, a couple of friends and one of his sons. The fire was going (too wet to worry about setting off an emergency) we found a site, unloaded and took our chairs over to sit under the shade of a salmon gum. Met everyone we didn't know, and got chatting. In no time, we were all swapping stories, anecdotes and getting to know each other, as you do!!!!!

One of John's cousins lives 70kms east of Albany and owns the original Hassell Farm. They are working on a B & B named Kingfisher Cottage and refurbishing the sheds with historical farm machinery. There is another historic museum at the original Moir Farm in Bremer Bay. We will have to do a Farm Stay tour along the south coast, especially with views of the Southern Ocean. I bought some flyers home and will put them in the Museum if anyone wants to take a trip.

John and Marilyn Dunne came in for afternoon tea and were talking about mallee fowls, their nesting habits, how they were told that mallee fowls were nearly extinct- in some places- and couldn't believe that some environmentalists thought they were nearly gone when there are hundreds on Remlap. Buddy Kent had many on his farm in Bodallin. I remember taking some people out to have a look at his mallee fowl mounds and the mallee fowls were clucking around his house doing a normal chook scratch. They weren't in the least bit fazed by all the visitors.

Remlap Station is a unique place. It is small now, compared to when it was leased to the Palmers circa 1920, with around about a million acres of land. The Station is now destocked and used only for Tourism and research.

It borders the east bank of Lake Moore, has a granite rock with gnamma on it, crystals have been found, we have seen eagles nests in the tall trees along the lake banks, an

old orchard grove from way back, dams with gilgies (I hope), a native well, boodie rats nest (now thought to be extinct), the emu fence and lots to explore. John and Marilyn allow camping but it is only by appointment as they don't want the station to be overrun with campers at any one time. The rules are: "take only photos and leave only footprints" which is pretty much what everyone should be doing anyway.

Reminiscing about a trip we did on the Gus Luck Track years ago, I was regaling the story about a couple who gave us a lesson on "human relationships" (nudge, nudge, wink, wink) in full view of the rest of us on the verandah, (imagine eyeballs popping out) and was asking John who the white haired fellow was that Runger and John were speaking with, and it turns out it was the male partner, and he didn't even remember. Phew! He now has Parkinsons and is not as sociable as he used to be – apparently he had been a bit of a boy!!! Over breakfast I let everyone know who was listening the previous night that I had put my foot in it big time, and it brought the house down. It pays to take a recce before one opens ones mouth, hey?

We had a great time. John, as host, enjoyed himself immensely, with many of his favourite people being in attendance. It was a weekend for memories and reconnections. Thank you John and Annie for a fabulous weekend and for asking us to celebrate with you on one or your milestones. Happy birthday.





COVID-19 Phase 1B VACCINE ROLL OUT AT SOUTHERN CROSS GENERAL PRACTICE

We would like to shed some light on the rollout of the Astra Zeneca vaccine here at the practice. As you may be aware, General Practices within Australia will be receiving the Astra Zeneca vaccines to accommodate Phase 1B and future phases after that. Firstly to commence with Phase 1B:-

Who are eligible in Phase 1B?

- persons aged \geq 70 years
- other healthcare workers
- Aboriginal aged > 55 years
- adults with an underlying medical condition associated with increased risk of severe COVID-19 illness, including disability.
- critical and high risk workers including defence, police, fire, emergency services and those people working in the meat processing industry.

The following is stated by the Department of Health, (*March 2021*).

As vaccine stock will be limited in the early stages of Phase 1b, start dates and dosage allocation will be dependent on vaccine availability. In the first four weeks, there will be rapid on-boarding of general practices to build a broad national footprint across Australia, complemented by General Practitioner led Respiratory Clinics and Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services.

To ensure efficient and equitable distribution of vaccines across the country, a tiered dose allocation model has been developed that maximises the number of practices coming on board each week, based on available vaccine supply. General practices have been assigned an allocation based on geographic distribution, density of Phase 1b priority population in the area.

Southern Cross General Practice is:

- scheduled to commence vaccinating from Week 4 of the Phase 1b rollout in the week of 12 April 2021; and
- will receive an allocation of 50 doses per week.

We hope the above narration has updated you as to where our practice is in regards to accommodating the roll out of this very important situation.

ABOUT OUR VACCINATION PROCESS – subject to change.

Anticipated process for a COVID-19 vaccination clinic at our practice is:

A clinic possibly Tuesday & Thursday afternoons for a couple of hours, seeing people in batches of 10 as 15 minute appointments.

You will undergo pre-vaccination screening with a nurse to ensure you meet eligibility for vaccination. Vaccine will then be administered. You will then be required to wait in the waiting room for 15 minutes minimum to be observed post vaccination.

For those who are eligible in Phase 1B, when the time comes you can book your vaccination appointment by phoning the practice 90491 147.



Below are our tips for how to build a small connection with your neighbours, so on Neighbour Day, you already know everyone well enough to host a friendly event.

Start With a Smile

We've all been there, you're heading out to the car and in a bit of a rush, maybe you're herding a minor flock of boisterous kids or pets, maybe juggling some groceries, either way, your mind is elsewhere. Then you see a neighbour in the driveway adjacent and although your mind is everywhere else, this is the perfect moment to begin your neighbourly mission. **Make it a habit to always flash a friendly smile or say hello in these moments - it's sure to make a difference!**


