Assessment Criteria:

Preference will be given to landholders who haven't received many/any Shire projects in the past.

- Species must be planted to tackle poor production areas (issues such as salinity, wind erosion, or other 'land degradation matters').
- Pasture seed must be purchased & planted within the financial year of 22/23. Proof of purchase to be shown. Planting timing may be weather-determined.
- Saltbush Seedlings will be delivered on-farm early July 2022. Applicants must be able to
 accept, care for (water every day) and plant seedlings at any time within this period.
- Stock must be kept off seedlings for the first 12 months.

Planting information:

Seedlings should be planted in blocks or belts at 1000 stems/ha depending on soil capacity and layout. There should be barley grass present as indicator that the species will survive on intended site.


Seedling Information:

The Shire of Yilgarn is proposing that a subsidy of 30 cents per seedling be paid by the receiving landholder to help offset the costs involved (each seedling costs 60 cents). Oldman Saltbush is native to the semi-arid areas of Australia and is well adapted to conditions. Yilgarn Mallee. Oil mallee and Gimlet are native and great for wind breaks for stock protection and reducing soil erosion.

Influenza Vaccination Program for 2022

Annual Influenza vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications. During the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been reduced circulation of influenza virus and lower levels of influenza vaccine coverage compared with previous years. With borders reopening, a resurgence of influenza is expected in 2022.

Government funded influenza vaccinations are in stock at the practice. Appointments can be booked now.

Eligibility for government funded influenza vaccines in WA are:

- · persons 65 years or older
- · children 6 months to less than 10 years
- · pregnant women (any trimester)
- · Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- · individuals 6 months and older with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - o cardiac disease
 - o chronic respiratory conditions
 - o chronic neurological conditions
 - o Immunocompromising conditions
 - o diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - o renal disease
 - o haematological disorders
 - o children aged 6 months to 10 years receiving long term aspirin therapy.

HELP STOP FLU FROM SPREADING

Good hygiene practices, such as washing your hands thoroughly with soap and warm water can assist with reducing the risk of infection.

Díd you know?

Did you know that the Commercial Hotel was the first two-story pub in town? At that stage there was five pubs. The Commercial was situated in Sirius Street, behind Kevin Collins' house. The hotel was built by Parker Cunnington in 1901, who closed down his pub at Hopes Hill and transferred the licence to the Commercial. The other pubs kicked up a fuss and told the licensing magistrate there was not enough business for them all. The magistrate was unmoved and said the town needed a decent hotel and not hovels like the others. Absentee landlords waxed fat out of Southern Cross. The Commercial had twelve rooms on the ground floor plus another bar and bedrooms upstairs. It cost £2,500, a fortune at the time. But despite being the best hotel in Southern Cross it was built in the wrong part of town to win market share. The railway line had been extended to Kalgoorlie, and the railway end of town never picked up afterwards. The First World War also impacted, with goldmining almost non-existent. By 1924 the population was down to 350, leading to the Commercial Hotel being de-licensed, along with the Southern Cross Hotel. Castlemaine Brewery had paid £6,000 for the Commercial in 1911 - they received £156 compensation, plus £100 scrap value for doors and window frames when pulled down. The salvaged material went to Kellerberrin and may have been used for their pub. The empty block at Southern Cross was then used to store farm machinery, seized by the bailiff during the depression. The machinery just rusted away. As for the hole where the pub cellar stood, it was not filled in until a house was built on the block around 1960. One day a sign will be erected to indicate the history of this block. Stay tuned! **©Lance Stevens**

LEGEND OF THE SOUTHERN CROSS

(AS FOUND IN YILGARN HISTORY MUSEUM'S ABORIGINAL FILE)

A long, long time ago there was no Southern Cross in the sky. The stars were all clustered together in groups in the Milky Way but there were wide open spaces between the groups. Sometimes one cluster of stars visited another and occasionally stars got lost and fell down to earth as we see them do even now.

On some occasions it took the stars a long time to return to their own country. Even now they can be seen travelling to and fro if one watches the heavens carefully.

The Southern Cross is different from the other stars, however, for the stars that compose it never travel. They are women.

Originally these women, who now make the Southern Cross, belonged to a tribe that lived near the sea.

The tribe, one time, had been travelling a long distance and at dusk they had to camp at a place where the wood and the water were some distance apart. After a little discussion, it was decided to build the huts nearer to the wood than to the water.

This was accordingly done and after supper the grown-ups went down to the water and had a drink.

The children, however, were too tired to make the trip to the water-hole so several of the girls were given big pieces of bark and told to fetch some water for the youngsters.

Instead of coming straight back the girls stopped to play along the way.

They scooped the water up in the pieces of bark and splashed each other and wasted the water.

After they had been gone for some time, the men became anxious and went to look for them. It was getting dark and the girls should have returned long before.

When the men found them playing, they were very angry.

They took their hunting spears and prodded them in the calves of their legs.

The girls tried to protect themselves by holding the pieces of bark over their legs and by running away.

They ran as fast as they could but the men followed them with their spears. As they ran, a big wind came up and suddenly blew them into the sky.

The men threw their spears after them but they scattered to avoid the spears and that is why they are not clustered like the other stars.

Ever since that day they have remained in the sky and form the Southern Cross.

They are a lesson to other girls not to loiter and play when they have duties to perform, for in being so far from each other, they can never find a man and, therefore, they can never get married.

NOTICE OF BAITING PROGRAM FOR WILD DOGS

The Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group (EWBG) advises that from January 1st 2022 ongoing, heavy baiting programs (using 1080 meat baits) to control wild dogs will be carried out by Licensed Pest Management Technicians on Unallocated Crown Land to the east of the State Barrier Fence. In addition to 1080 baiting programs, technicians will be using foot hold traps treated with Strychnine to remove Wild Dogs that are currently impacting the livestock industry in the EWBG region.

From January 1st 2022, the standard wild dog control methods will be ongoing and this may include setting of traps and dispersing of 1080 meat baits in the groups operational area.

The poison baits will remain toxic for a number of months or until substantial rainfall is received. People are advised to take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Warning signs have been placed where applicable on Unallocated Crown Land and main access roads.

Picnic sites and recreational reserves are **not** included within the baiting program; however, baiting may take place adjacent to such areas and domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs.



Exercise caution to prevent your pets from being poisoned by 1080 baits.



If a wild dog is sighted, please report to the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group immediately.



If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre (phone 13 11 26).
