



PUBLIC NOTICE ROAD WORKS – REPLACEMENT OF WATER PIPE

Please be advised that there will be road works and closures occurring between 7th June 2022 and 1st July 2022 for the Altair St laneway bordered by Hydra and Gruis streets, and Gruis Street within the Southern Cross townsite.

The laneway work will occur from Hydra St end first, with the road being backfilled and compacted to allow public access at the end of each day. This work is estimated to occur from the 7th to the 17th of June.

The Gruis Street works and detour are estimated to take place from the 20th of June directing traffic along Antares or Altair Streets between 7.00am and 5.00pm. Gruis St will reopen at the end of each day with possible lane closures and speed restrictions until the work is complete.

Influenza Vaccination Program for 2022

Annual Influenza vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been reduced circulation of influenza virus and lower levels of influenza vaccine coverage compared with previous years. With borders reopening, a resurgence of influenza is expected in 2022.

Government funded influenza vaccinations are in stock at the practice. Appointments can be booked now.

Eligibility for government funded influenza vaccines in WA are:

- · persons 65 years or older
- \cdot children 6 months to less than 10 years
- · pregnant women (any trimester)
- · Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- \cdot individuals 6 months and older with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - o cardiac disease
 - o chronic respiratory conditions
 - o chronic neurological conditions
 - o Immunocompromising conditions
 - o diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - o renal disease
 - o haematological disorders
 - o children aged 6 months to 10 years receiving long term aspirin therapy.

HELP STOP FLU FROM SPREADING

Good hygiene practices, such as washing your hands thoroughly with soap and warm water can assist with reducing the risk of infection.

COVID Vaccination Winter Booster

The cold weather can make it easier for viruses to infect our bodies.

As Australia moves into winter, an additional booster dose, or 'winter dose', is recommended for people at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 who have already had their first booster dose.

If it has been at least 4 months since your first booster dose and you fit into one of the below categories, you should book an appointment to have another booster dose as soon as possible before or during winter.

Who is eligible?

- 65 years and older
- A resident of an aged care or disability care facility
- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and aged 50years and older.
- people aged 16-64 who have:
 - Immunocompromising conditions
 - Cancer
 - Chronic inflammatory conditions (lupus, rheumatoid arthritis, crohns disease, ulcerative colitis, and similar)
 - Chronic lung disease
 - Chronic liver disease
 - Severe chronic kidney disease
 - Chronic neurological conditions
 - Diabetes
 - Chronic cardiac disease
 - People with disability with significant or complex health needs or multiple comorbidities
 - Severe obesity with $BMI \ge 40 \text{ kg/m}^2$
 - Severe underweight with BMI < 16.5 kg/m2

People who have had COVID-19 should also wait at least 3 months before having an additional dose.

- East of the intersection construction of a 1.9km acceleration lane.



I was fortunate enough to start my working career in Kalgoorlie and from then on I always knew I would come back to live.

Now I am here to set up to provide hearing care to Kalgoorlie, Norseman, Leonora, Esperance, Kambalda and Southern Cross. I believe this will enhance the lives of generations of locals, helping them to hear, allowing them to hear, allowing them to engage so they can be heard and helping to maintain the connection that hearing brings with friends and loved ones.

Díð you know?

Did you know that tanks called summit tanks are built at the highest point between each pumping station along the goldfields pipe line. Their role is to keep the main pipe pressurised, and to be a reserve of water if needed.

Years ago when the pumps operated by steam, these tanks were filled during the day, with the water released at night to flow without pumping. The pumps could be spelled for a few hours. Today the electric pumps work around the clock because of demand. Another recent addition is the robotic camera which floats through the pipe to find faults. This is how an illegal pipe connection was located a few years ago near Karalee.

The pipe led to a marijuana plantation hidden in the bush, and a surprise visit for the grower from the police. In the early years the pipeline had problems with pitting from within, tiny holes appearing in the pipe. It was caused by air getting inside and causing rust. It was rectified by lowering the entry and exit pipes at pump stations to be below the water level, thus no air.

The inside of large pipes are now coated with concrete during manufacture, the pipe spun at speed to spread the concrete by centrifugal force. The pipes of today are welded together to be a continuous weld.

Originally each 30 foot section was affixed to the next pipe with steel bands, with lead sheeting hammered into the joint to make it waterproof. Length runners on bicycles patrolled the pipe, using a hammer and lead balls to stop any leaks. Their bikes were heavy duty and must have been hard to push.

A leather bag containing tools and spare lead hung under the main bar.

The sprung seat was huge compared to an average bike. Vic Fields ran the length from Southern Cross to Ghooli, as well as half way towards Moorine. The remains of his shelter-shed half way to Moorine is still there 60 years later.

Pop Driver who was based at Moorine did the other leg. Pop was Geoff Metzke's grandfather. These people kept the water flowing: they are an important part of our history. To shut the main down to effect repairs meant shutting down all pumping stations to Mundaring, a decision not taken lightly.

On one occasion a railway sleeper was used to plug a large hole in the main pipe, with two men holding the sharpened sleeper while another hammered it into the pipe with a sledge hammer.

The sleeper was then sawn off level with the pipe and a plate welded over top.

My father told me the water pressure took off a heap of his skin while holding the sleeper. So things were done in those days. ©Lance Stevens



Biosecurity funding schemes to tackle pest threats

More than 99% of Western Australian cattle, sheep and goat producers and grain, seed and hay growers actively support the biosecurity of their industries by making financial contributions to WA's <u>Industry Funding Schemes</u>. (https://www.agric.wa.gov.au/bam/industry-funding-schemes)

Farmer contributions to Industry Funding Schemes will support a range of priority animal disease and pest control programs next financial year.

The schemes are an integral part of the Western Australia's biosecurity system, helping to maintain access to domestic and international markets and supporting the viability and profitability of agricultural industries.

For the 2022/23 financial year:

Cattle: Producers pay a 20 cent contribution on the sale of each animal/carcase to fund surveillance programs for bovine tuberculosis, enzootic bovine leucosis and Johne's disease in cattle.

Sheep and goats: Producers pay a 15 cent contribution on the sale of each animal/ carcase to fund activities to address wild dogs as well as continuing a program to control virulent footrot in the Western Australian sheep and goat flock.

Grains and seed: Growers pay a 25 cent contribution on the first sale of every tonne of grain and seed grown within the South West Land Division to fund continuing programs to control skeleton weed and eradicate three-horned bedstraw.

Hay: Growers pay 12.5 cents per tonne on the first sale of hay grown within the South West Land Division to fund the skeleton weed and three-horned bedstraw programs.

Producers/growers who wish to opt out of the scheme/s must submit a 2022/23 <u>Notice</u> of <u>Opt Out form</u> (https://www.agric.wa.gov.au/bam/opting-out) by 30 June 2022. Producers that opt out lose all entitlements to assistance and compensation via the scheme.

The continued support of producers for the schemes enables the WA livestock and grain/hay industries to identify and invest in biosecurity activities that help maintain our market advantage and the sustainability of the industries in Western Australia.



NOTICE OF BAITING PROGRAM FOR WILD DOGS

The Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group (EWBG) advises that from January 1st 2022 ongoing, heavy baiting programs (using 1080 meat baits) to control wild dogs will be carried out by Licensed Pest Management Technicians on Unallocated Crown Land to the east of the State Barrier Fence. In addition to 1080 baiting programs, technicians will be using foot hold traps treated with Strychnine to remove Wild Dogs that are currently impacting the livestock industry in the EWBG region.

From January 1st 2022, the standard wild dog control methods will be ongoing and this may include setting of traps and dispersing of 1080 meat baits in the groups operational area.

The poison baits will remain toxic for a number of months or until substantial rainfall is received. People are advised to take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Warning signs have been placed where applicable on Unallocated Crown Land and main access roads.

Picnic sites and recreational reserves are **not** included within the baiting program; however, baiting may take place adjacent to such areas and domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs.



Exercise caution to prevent your pets from being poisoned by 1080 baits.



If a wild dog is sighted, please report to the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group immediately.



If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre (phone 13 11 26).
