Keep Australia foot-and-mouth disease free

Travelling to Australia or receiving international mail?

What is foot-and-mouth disease?

Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) is a highly contagious animal disease that affects all cloven-hoofed animals including cattle, buffalo, sheep, goats, deer, pigs and camels.

FMD can survive in frozen, chilled and freeze-dried foods including meat and dairy products.

It is not present in Australia. An outbreak would cause sickness in animals, and greatly impact Australian meat (beef, lamb and pork) and dairy farmers.

There is no threat to human health from this disease.

What goods can carry foot-and-mouth disease?

- Dairy products and meat products containing beef, lamb and pork. These goods are not allowed into Australia from FMD-infected countries.
- Items such as clothing, shoes and equipment used on farms, in rural or wilderness areas, markets, zoos or near animals.
- · Animal skins, camping and hunting equipment and trophies.

How do I stop the spread of foot-and-mouth disease?

DON'I

- X Bring meat or dairy products to Australia in your baggage.
- × Buy meat or dairy products online from overseas sellers.

DO

- Tell family and friends overseas not to send you any meat or dairy products.
- Check biosecurity import conditions before sending goods to Australia – agriculture.gov.au/bicon.
- Clean any equipment, clothing and shoes thoroughly before you send them or travel to Australia.
- Declare and present any risk goods to a biosecurity officer for inspection on arrival in Australia or put it in a bin.
- Declare if you have visited a rural area or been in contact with, or near, farm animals.

DON'T BRING OR SEND MEAT AND DAIRY PRODUCTS TO AUSTRALIA

CLEAN AND DECLARE all shoes, clothing and equipment used near animals or in rural areas

It's everyone's responsibility to help keep Australia free from FMD



Serious penalties apply if you breach Australia's biosecurity laws.

You may be issued with an infringement notice of up to \$2,664.

Your visa may be cancelled and if so, you will be refused entry into Australia.



Pioneers of Pilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Abelman family: Henry Abelman started a jewellery and optician shop on lot 16 (present supermart) during the late 1890's. Records show he was a watchmaker, jeweller, optician, importer and tobacconist. Kids would press up against the glass to get a better look at his novelty toys, while he chastised them in broken English 'get your snotty noses off my window.'

His two daughters, Berna and Rachael, were gifted musicians frequently under notice during their school days at the Convent. At a young age they played in the local band and could also dance. Probably through lack of opportunity they did not go on to make a career out of their undoubted acting and musical skills. A third daughter worked at the Club Hotel as a barmaid.

The family moved on around 1915 to other goldfields towns, Berna and Rachael remaining spinsters and eventually taking over the family business in Subiaco. They taught music as a sideline, Berna the violin, and Raye the piano, and passed their gift on to pupils who went on to honours at University.

Their shop was full of fancy goods, pendulum clocks, jewellery, rings, silverware, and old spectacles, some over 80 years old, which in the end they preferred to keep along with their memories, rather than sell.

Berna died in 1958 and Raye in 1971. Their treasured memories were auctioned off and we hope went to good homes.

MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTHERN CROSS 4TH OCTOBER, 1899 Specifications for lighting Lamps, supplying Oil etc. and watering trees

All Street Lamps (21) within the Municipality to be kept clean, and all breakages to be made good by the Contractor, for the next ensuing twelve (12) months. The lamps to be lit every night at within half an hour after sunset, except on moonlight nights, and to be kept burning till 1 o'clock each morning. The Lamp Glasses and Glass on Frames to be kept clean.

The manner in which the work is carried out to be to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk who will supervise the work.

The trees within the Municipality to be watered and attended to as often as may be deemed necessary by the Council or Town Clerk, at least once a week, unless in the case of rain, when it may require doing at longer intervals, at the discretion of the Council,

The following <u>Penalties</u> will be enforced for non compliance with the foregoing conditions:-

- For neglecting to light any one of the Street Lamps not exceeding 2/6.
- For breaking Lamps, Lamp Glasses, Glass in frames, or any other damages in connection with the property, and not having the damage repaired in time for the next night's lighting not to exceed 2/6 for each offence.
- For allowing each Lamp to go out before the specified time not exceeding 2/6 for each lamp.
- For neglecting to light any one Lamp at the proper hour not exceeding 2/6 for each lamp.

The best brand of Kerosene, Lamp Glasses, Wicks and other necessities to be used. Moonlight nights will be considered to be when the moon rises not later than 6.30p.m. in summer and 5.30p.m. in winter and sets not before 1 o'clock a.m.

Penalties in reference to Watering Trees.

- all water will be supplied by the Council and the Contractor will liable should he not report to the Town Clerk to have it replenished when running short, under a penalty not exceeding the sum of 10/0 (ten shillings -\$1).
- A penalty of £1 will be enforced for neglecting to attend to the watering of the trees when directed
- to do so.
- For damaging any tree when watering, through neglect or carelessness, a fine of £1 will be
- enforced.
- The contractor to procure two approved Bondsmen in the sum of £10 each before signing the contract, who must agree to forfeit that amount should the work not be carried out satisfactorily.
- All trees must be watered with a proper watering can with a perforated nozzle. The amount of water to be used will be specified when orders are given for watering.
- The contractor will be charged for any wilful waste of same.

7th October, 1899.

I agree to complete contract for Lighting LAMPS, Watering Trees, and all else contained there and will do the work as therein specified, and fay all fines imposed thereunder for the sum of £9.0.0. per Calendar month commencing on Monday the 9th day of October, 1899.

In conjunction with this Contract I also agree to attend to the cleaning of the Chambers for the sum of £1.4.0. per calendar month.




