



SHIRE OF YILGARN STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN REVIEW

The Shire of Yilgarn Strategic Community Plan 2020 – 2030 is the guiding document for the Shire of Yilgarn Council and Administration.

It is the responsibility of all Local Governments in Western Australia to demonstrate through their strategic plan, on-going planning for the social, environmental and economic future for the whole of the Shire.

The Plan incorporates the vision and aspirations of the community and allows the Council to prioritise service delivery and projects that have been identified as important to community members.

Whilst the Strategic Community Plan is a ten year plan, it is not fixed for ten years as it would be long out of date by then. Rather, it is a "rolling" plan which is reviewed every two years. The two-yearly reviews alternate between a minor review (updating as needed) and a major review (going through all the community consultation steps again).

Having been implemented in 2020, the plan is due for a minor review in 2022, and whilst detailed community consultation is not required, it is important to obtain the general views of the community, to ensure the Plan is still on the right track with regards to community expectations.

The Shire of Yilgarn is encouraging ratepayers and community members to read the plan and provide feedback on its relevancy and currency given the current social, environmental and economic climate.

Feedback received will be used to determine whether a modification to the Plan is required. Council will make a determination, based on recommendations from Staff after reviewing submissions, as to whether modifications to the current plan is required. This is intended to be undertaken at the September Ordinary Council meeting.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN FEEDBACK GUIDE





Bushfires Act 1954

Notice to all Owners & Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Yilgarn

Requirements to Clear Firebreaks

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33(1) of the Bush Fires Act you are hereby required to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or other-wise clear firebreaks on all land owned or occupied by you by 1 November 2022 and thereafter to keep these firebreaks clear of all flammable material until 31 March 2023. Firebreaks are required in locations and to the specifications detailed below.

LAND WITHIN TOWNSITES

- (a) On land not exceeding 2023 square metres in area, all flammable material shall be removed.
- (b) On land exceeding 2023 square metres in area, a firebreak 3 metres wide shall be constructed inside and immediately adjoining all external boundaries.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (d) Haystacks must not be located more than 20 metres to an external boundary. They shall be surrounded by a 10 metre wide firebreak situated between 10 and 20 metres distance from stack.
- (e) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967.

RURAL LAND

- (a) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately inside and adjoining all property boundaries.
- (b) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed between 10 and 20 metres distance from and surrounding all haystacks.
- (d) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961 and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967 and which include that a firebreak 6 metres wide will be provided immediately surrounding storage areas.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS DURING HARVEST AND RELATED ACTIVITIES

- (a) A minimum of 600 litres of water to be kept onsite at all times during harvest or related activities; and
- (b) By the 2023/2024 summer fire season, all minimum water requirements are to be carried by a motorised vehicle **OR** a trailer that is <u>connected</u> to a motorised vehicle at <u>all times</u> and is able to be deployed immediately

GENERAL

If for any reason it is considered by the owner or occupier of land that it is impractical to comply with the requirements of this notice, a request may be made to Council to approve alternative fire protection measures. Such application shall be accompanied by a sketch or drawing of the proposed variations and should be lodged at the Council offices no later than 31 October 2022.

Where approval of a proposed variation is not granted by Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. The penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$5,000 and notwithstanding prosecution; Council may enter on the land and carry out the requisite works at the owner / occupiers expense.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING TIMES

Restricted Burning Period: 19 September 2022 to 31 October 2022 and 16 February 2023 to 31 March 2023

(Note: Permits to burn during this period are required. Permits must be obtained from your nearest Bush Fire Control Officer)

Prohibited Burning Period: 1 November 2022 to 15 February 2023

(Note: Permits to burn stubble from the previous seasons crop will not be issued until 1 March 2023)




Lego Club



There is a phone for you to access phone self-service or speak to an agency service officer.


If you would rather use your mobile phone or tablet, we have free Wi-Fi available 24/7. You do not need a password so you can get online straight away.

Pioneers of Pilgarn

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Andre, Christian Henry: Henry built a hotel/ store at Parkers Range in 1901 and named it 'The Terminus' While his wife ran the pub, Henry prospected the surrounding area for gold, naming shows he found after his children, Constance Una, Dulcie Jean and Gordon Highlander. In 1910 he moved his hotel license to Marvel Loch, where he built a new hotel named 'South Yilgarn.' A feature was carbide lighting. Andre became the unofficial mayor of Marvel Loch, serving as member of Yilgarn Road Board, storekeeper, postmaster, and band leader. Over the years Andre saw Marvel Loch rise and fall several times, its fortunes tied to the state of mining and price of gold. Andre sold his pub in 1935 at the height of the Mount Palmer boom. He made enough to take a trip around the world, retiring afterwards to Perth. South ©Lance Stevens Yilgarn Hotel still stands.
