NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPOSE DIFFERENTIAL RATES

Section 6.36 Local Government Act 1995

The Shire of Yilgarn, at the April 2024 Ordinary Council Meeting, resolved to adopt the 2024/2025 Rate Objects & Reasons which included the Differential and Minimums Rating model expected to be imposed as part of the 2024/2025 Budget. The 2024/2025 Rate Objects & Reasons recommended the following differential and minimum rates:

Hot and cold cup lids Enforcement begins 1 March 2024

Western Australia's

Plan for Plastics

Stage 2

What is proposed to be banned and when?

The sale and supply of plastic lids for cups made wholly or partly from plastic will be phased out from 27 February 2023. The ban includes bioplastic lids, plastic-lined paperboard lids, and aqueous coatings.

There will be a transition period of 12 months before the rules are enforced to allow businesses to use up supplies and source alternative products.

Enforcement of the ban on plastic lids for cups will commence on 1 March 2024.



Why ban single-use lids?

Each year Western Australians use more than 250 million plastic cup lids for hot and cold beverages and food.

Plastic lids are commonly littered. Many are made of polystyrene, polylactic acid and crystallised polylactic acid which are not recyclable and contaminate recycling streams. Plastic-lined paperboard also contaminates composting and recycling streams.

What is not included in the ban?

- cup lids made from plastic designed for washing and reuse, for example as part of a 'keep' cup
- plastic cup lids used as part of a pre-packaged product
- uncoated all-fibre lids.

What alternatives are there?

There are all-fibre non-plastic lids suitable for hot and cold drinks, which do not contain any plastic lining, coating, laminate or dispersion layer.

Reusable products with lids are widely available for cold drinks such as smoothies and bubble tea.

Customers can bring their own reusable cup and lid.

Will it cost more to buy drinks with a non-plastic lid?

Compliant alternatives for plastic lids may initially cost slightly more but this is expected to decrease over time as more options become available.

Who will the ban apply to?

The ban applies to all businesses, manufacturers, retailers and distributors that sell or supply plastic cup lids.

Single-use plastic promotional film ban

Enforcement begins from June 2024

Western Australia's

Plan for Plastics

Stage 2

What is proposed to be banned and when?

The purchase and use of single-use plastic promotional film for short-term outdoor applications will be banned from June 2024.

Short term use refers to signage which is used as temporary or transient signage and which is intended for a single-use only.

Why ban single-use plastic promotional film?

Single-use plastic promotional film is commonly used for advertising.

The film is harmful to the environment when it is not disposed of correctly. This type of plastic film can blow away, fragment in the environment and end up in waterways or oceans. It is made from petroleum-based materials, which are not biodegradable and can take hundreds of years to decompose.

This type of plastic film is characterised as 'single-use' with limited opportunities for recycling.

What is not included in the ban?

Forms of plastic promotional film not included in the ban are:

- indoor use of plastic promotional film, where it is commonly used as signage for sales in large display containers or bins
- health and safety bunting like police tape
- heavier plastics used in canvas signage, typically with reinforcement points that are tied up with rope or cable ties
- heavier plastic fence mesh wraps.

What alternatives are there?

Single-use plastic promotional film can be replaced with plastic-free alternatives such as banners/signs made with reusable cloth.

To whom would the proposed ban apply?

The ban applies to all individuals purchasing, or using, single-use plastic promotional film outdoors in Western Australia for less than 48 hours.

Styles family of Southern Cross

The following article is an extract from a publication written by Lesley Styles, formerly of Southern Cross. Lesley's father, Cecil Styles owned a drapery shop, where the Pharmacy is today. Lesley became an artist and writer. This is her impression of the town where she grew up:

The main street of Southern Cross was so wide my father used to say it was a wise man who took a cut lunch with him if he planned to walk to the other side. When I was a little shaver 'up there' in the 1920's, the main street was a vast expanse of gravelled mud or dust --depending on the season -- and split down the middle by a row of pepper trees and hitching rails.

The Perth to Kalgoorlie highway was gravelled and graded, but fraught with surprises; sly dust filled craters, soft hilly sides, and corrugations that looked like a painting of 'Storm at Sea.'

If anyone mentioned they intended making the two day trip 'down below' to Perth he was given the same look King Feisal gave Lawrence when he said he was going to Aquabar.

There were few motor cars then. Each one was an object of awe and wonder for 'tin lizzie' stood mighty tall. Cars moved with a minimum of efficiency and a maximum of noise, backfiring with an alarming frequency. But they had handsome canvas hoods, miraculous clip-on windows, and a thermometer on the radiator to tell you when the front half was due to explode. The running boards were just the thing to stand on -- as they had already found out in Chicago.

Horses and sulkies was more the thing at the time. All shop verandas and fences had hitching rigs and you got your garden fertiliser right outside your front gate. Saturday was a gala day for sulkies.

Late closing was very much the 'in' thing. Everybody came down the street to shop and promenade along the dust footpaths. Lamps shown brightly from shop windows, bathing in old gold the shuffling horses as they sagged in their shafts and snorted and munched mysteriously inside canvas feeding bags.

Children ran excitedly from everywhere to nowhere, women gossiped and the men grew rowdy down at the Palace Hotel. One by one the shops closed, the lights were blown out and the men would straggle up from the Palace. Wives would nag, children would wail, then the darkening night was filled with the clif-clif of wooden wheels on gravel and a glow-worm parade of swaying hurricane lamps fading down the land.

There were camel trains in those days too. Camels were the only means of transport to many remote mining settlements and they carried a strange cargo. I can recall two or three camel teams. You never ever saw them come into town; they would just emerge from nowhere, slup- slup slupping through the dust to a vacant lot near the Palace.

What I liked best of all was the train. It made my young heart jump with fright and excitement, but I thought it was magnificent. It was safer than cars or camels, and certainly aeroplanes. The express arrived about 10.30pm and it was quite the thing to walk down to the station to see it come in -- although that was never the reason for going. You went to mail a letter in the 'late bag'- it was more sophisticated.

Stumbling along the dark stony road on the long mile to the station, you see the train first as a miniature dawn shining over five mile hill, then as a busy caterpillar pulsing with light as it raced across the salt lakes screaming hoarsely. Not long after you'd reached the station, the train would come roaring in -- straight at you, breathing fire and shaking the ground under your feet. The only escape was to bury your face in your mother's skirt until the engine had passed, taking most of the noise with it.

You could then look at the lighted wonder of the carriages gliding to a stop. You stared at faces behind the glass windows of the carriages, and strangers peered back at you. With them in the compartments, in the yellow glow of light, were real beds, suitcases, and more sleepy passengers than you had ever seen before.

Then came the porters with their lanterns. On the station a porter clanged a bell and chanted 'Sunn Crawsss - Hopp pies anna cuppatea.' The train was a way of life. It was the one unfailing link with the world outside, bringing it much closer, driving away isolation with one toot from its fiery smoke stack."

This was Southern Cross through the eyes of a little 'shaver'.

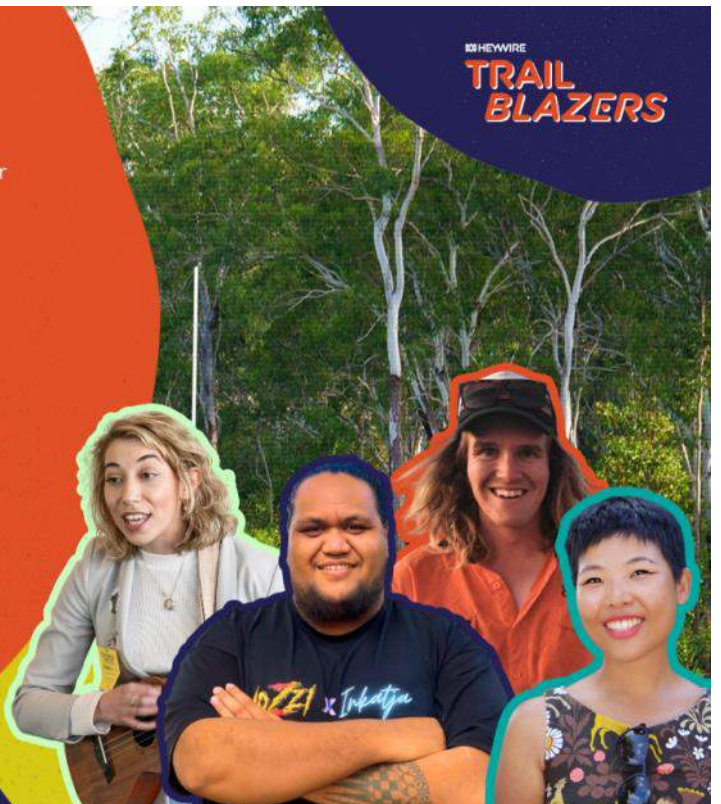

Lenneberg, Jack: Lenneberg was the most successful prospector in Yilgarn's history. His most famous find was the Marvel Loch which he named after a racehorse that won the Caulfield Cup. Lenneberg also discovered the Never-Never, Francis Furnace, Iron Duke, Democrat, and Sandfly. He had the knack of finding gold. It is likely the south area would have languished for years if not for Lenneberg's gift of locating reefs and lodes covered with topsoil and absence of any outcrop. Tall and good looking, Jack died of an incurable disease in 1923 and is buried in the local cemetery.
