



# Notice to all Owners & Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Yilgarn

# Requirements to Clear Firebreaks

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33(1) of the Bush Fires Act you are hereby required to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or other-wise clear firebreaks on all land owned or occupied by you by 1 November 2024 and thereafter to keep these firebreaks clear of all flammable material until 31 March 2025. Firebreaks are required in locations and to the specifications detailed below.

#### LAND WITHIN TOWNSITES

- (a) On land not exceeding 2023 square metres in area, all flammable material shall be removed.
- (b) On land exceeding 2023 square metres in area, a firebreak 3 metres wide shall be constructed inside and immediately adjoining all external boundaries.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (d) Haystacks must not be located more than 20 metres to an external boundary. They shall be surrounded by a 10 metre wide firebreak situated between 10 and 20 metres distance from stack.
- (e) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961 and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967.

#### **RURAL LAND**

- (a) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately inside and adjoining all property boundaries.
- (b) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed immediately surrounding all buildings.
- (c) Firebreaks 3 metres wide shall be constructed between 10 and 20 metres distance from and surrounding all haystacks.
- (d) Stored fuel, oil and flammable materials shall be protected from fire as prescribed in the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961 and the Flammable Liquids Regulations 1967 and which include that a firebreak 6 metres wide will be provided immediately surrounding storage areas.

# MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS DURING HARVEST AND RELATED ACTIVITIES

- (a) A minimum of 600 litres of water to be kept onsite at all times during harvest or related activities; and
- (b) By the 2024/2025 summer fire season, all minimum water requirements are to be carried by a motorised vehicle **OR** a trailer that is connected to a motorised vehicle at all times and is able to be deployed immediately

#### **GENERAL**

If for any reason it is considered by the owner or occupier of land that it is impractical to comply with the requirements of this notice, a request may be made to Council to approve alternative fire protection measures. Such application shall be accompanied by a sketch or drawing of the proposed variations and should be lodged at the Council offices no later than 31 October 2024.

Where approval of a proposed variation is not granted by Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. The penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$5,000 and notwithstanding prosecution; Council may enter on the land and carry out the requisite works at the owner / occupiers expense.

#### RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING TIMES

Restricted Burning Period: 19 September 2024 to 31 October 2024 and 16 February 2025 to 31 March 2025

(Note: Permits to burn during this period are required. Permits must be obtained from your nearest Bush Fire Control Officer)

Prohibited Burning Period: 1 November 2024 to 15 February 2025

(Note: Permits to burn stubble from the previous seasons crop will not be issued until 1 March 2025)

# Reminder to dog owners: Dogs in public places

A reminder to all dog owners, dogs shall not be in a public place unless it is:

- Held by a person who is capable of controlling the dog; or
- Securely tethered for a temporary purpose;

by means of a chain, cord, leash or harness of sufficient strength and not exceeding 2 metres in length.

Dogs can run freely, under suitable supervision, at the Southern Cross Dog Park and the grassed area behind the oval, as per map below. In all other areas your dog must be securely tethered.

Authorised Officers of the Shire can issue fines of \$200 to persons not complying with this requirement. For serious or continuing non-compliances, a maximum penalty of \$5,000 applies to each person liable for the control of the dog at that time.



Unsecured dogs in playgrounds, like Constellation Park, will be a focus for the Shire's Rangers.



# Pioneers of Pilgarn

# Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

McIntosh, William: Pegged the McIntosh mine at Parkers Range in 1888, which developed into the premier mine and biggest employer at the little settlement. He was well sinking at Moorine when Parker rode in to replenish his water.

Suspecting that Parker had found gold, McIntosh back-tracked him for 40 miles to Parker's new discovery, and pegged nearby. Not having the money to mine in his own right, McIntosh sold his lease and continued working for wages.

He eventually left for Pingelly where he bought a pub.

# An exhibition about the 1936 Prohibited Areas proclamations in the Goldfields region

The Prohibited Areas Proclamations are a part of Western Australia's hidden colonial history. Government proclamations were passed which prohibited Aboriginal people from within 6 miles of the town hall of many Goldfields towns and settlements, unless employed. These proclamations caused a great deal of distress as Aboriginal families tried to obtain food, water, health care and housing.





# What is proposed to be banned and when?

The sale and supply of plastic produce bags for fresh fruit and vegetables will be phased out from 27 February 2023. There will be a transition period of 18 months before the rules are enforced to allow businesses to use up supplies and source alternative products.

Enforcement of the ban on plastic produce bags for fruit and vegetables will commence on 1 September 2024.



# Why ban plastic produce bags?

Each year Western Australians use more than 115 million produce bags. Most end up in landfill but many are littered in the environment, harming our wildlife. There are no recycling options for produce bags in WA and the bags contaminate other recycling streams.

Important: The Government of Western
Australia is reviewing whether barrier bags
– beyond those used for fresh fruit and
vegetables – should be phased out, and
whether a design standard is required for
all produce/barrier bags. Businesses are
strongly encouraged to register for updates
via the Plan for Plastics webpage.

# What is not included in the ban?

- plastic produce bags which have achieved an Australian composting standard (AS 4736:2006 or AS 5810:2010)
- reusable produce bags made from plastic fabric such as polyester or nylon
- barrier bags necessary to meet food hygiene standards and avoid contamination from leaky products such as raw meat and fish
- barrier bags supplied in deli operations that supply dairy items such as cheeses and sliced meats including ham and salami
- produce bags supplied by bakeries or for the sale of loose baked goods
- produce pre-packaged off the premises (e.g. grape bags)
- bags sold on-shelf.

## What alternatives are there?

Customers can bring their own reusable bags or take loose produce. Retailers may provide disposable alternatives such as compostable produce bags, paper bags or boxes.



# Who will the ban apply to?

The ban applies to all businesses, manufacturers, retailers and distributors that sell or supply produce bags for the sale of fresh fruit and vegetables.



# How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



# Talk

For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

#### FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



# Do an activity together

Activities create conversation. Find an opportunity during everyday life activities to start the conversation and ask them how they are really feeling. Try doing activities together such as:



GOING FOR A WALK



GOING TO AN EVENT TOGETHER



GOING FOR A COFFEE OR A MEAL



## Listen

Just being there for someone and offering a listening ear can make a difference.

- Show them that you care and are here to listen to them.
- 2. Have patience, let others talk and don't judge.
- 3. Be reflective by repeating what they have said.
- Keep calm and accept that they may disagree with you.




