Ordinary Council Meeting Venue Change September 2024 and October 2024





Prohibited Areas Exhibition



An exhibition about the 1936 Prohibited Areas proclamations in the Goldfields region

The Prohibited Areas Proclamations are a part of Western Australia's hidden colonial history. Government proclamations were passed which prohibited Aboriginal people from within 6 miles of the town hall of many Goldfields towns and settlements, unless employed. These proclamations caused a great deal of distress as Aboriginal families tried to obtain food, water, health care and housing.

This exhibition uncovers this period in history.







Pioneers of Pilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

McIntyre, Archie: McIntyre was Yilgarn's most controversial and valued citizen between 1900 and 1920. He was a chemist by trade but a journalist by inclination, joining a consortium of businessmen to establish Southern Cross Times newspaper in 1900. Over the years, 'Bullant' McIntyre acquired a reputation for his vitriolic pen and court appearances charged with libel. He was also a Municipal Councillor with good ideas, but lacked the tact to get things done. He made two attempts to get into parliament and it is fortunate for other politicians that he failed. He also dabbled in mining and owned several leases. He believed in Yilgarn and invited entrepreneurs to come and see what the district had to offer, driving them around at his own expense. His death aged 49 was acknowledged at a sitting in parliament as a loss to the gold industry. McIntyre may not have been perfect, but he stands out for his deeds and fighting spirit promoting his town. ©Lance Stevens


