



# Share what living in the Wheatbelt is like with doctors of the future

One hundred medical students will be coming to the Wheatbelt in March 2025.

During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need you to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

The students will visit the following towns:

- Bruce Rock
- Cunderdin
- Kellerberrin
- Merredin
- Narrogin
- Southern Cross
- Tammin
- Westonia

As a host, we will ask you to provide accommodation for two or three students, to assist with transporting them to/ from town, and share what it is like to live in your town with the students. You are invited to come along to a Thank You Dinner with the students on the Thursday night.

#### Why host?

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life or the Wheatbelt.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are:

- more likely to explore rural career opportunities; and
- better able to provide patient-centred care to rural people.

Some students, who have previously been hosted through this program, continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs, some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine, and numerous students are now doctors in the Wheatbelt and other parts of rural/remote WA and Australia.



# Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life



While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website,

#### **Drinking water**

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

After a bushfire, we can assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on 13 13 85.

#### Round Five Vs Nukarni T20 in Merredin

Better late than never 3

The day starts with a trip in the pride of the fleet. Tunes sorted, fuel sorted, we are off, with a couple of stops on the way to pick up some fellow members. With some rain the day before, the astro turf pitch was looking like the safest option. The captain won the toss and elected to bat. After a Max Collins straight drive, young ex Yilgarn cricketer, Kaden Alcock managed to get a hand to it before the ball clattered into the stumps. At 2/18 in the 6th over, Brodie made his way out to the middle. Displaying some good stroke play, pushing it around, these two blokes put on 20 runs before Brodes had one get through and knock his castle over. The Big Tuna stepping out for his first taste of Merredin oval, finding the middle of the bat after knocking early singles. El Capitan and Morne put on an impressive 4th wicket stand of 53 with some glorious shots and both players looking in good touch. I think Tuna may like Merredin. A rare display of timing and bludgeoning saw Morne, who was c&b in the 17th over, make a quick fire 31 off 25, whilst the Skipper anchored the innings. Noah Della Bosca, taking advantage of the downtime, threw the whites in the cricket bag, made the journey to Merredin to walk out at No 6. The Rolls Royce was solid in defence while Max did his best to accelerate the scoring in the 19th over but, in his haste, chopped one on which brought myself to the crease. First ball well timed off the pads to get off strike, whew. Noah went the very next ball miscuing to that bloke Kaden. Shane Collins out to the crease. We had a conversation about something, which I clearly didn't hear because I just swung at everything. We turned back the clock with a couple of very quick singles taking the innings total to 6/102.

With too many chiefs out on the field the Captain told the bowlers to set their own fields. Andrew Steel started pretty dicey with 3 wides in the first 3 balls but the 9 ball over had the young bloke on a hat trick having the home side at 2/5. Both lbw, they were absolutely plumb. With Nick having a week off due to the clubs rotation policy, just kidding, he and Jo are watching the Foo Fighters, Brodie had the honour of opening the bowling from the other end, rolling down breeze. After the early breakthroughs the home side consolidated and got the innings back on track with a 32 run partnership ending when Tuna took a catch at mid on, off an Andrew Steel delivery giving him 3 wickets for the day. Brodes finally got a breakthrough in his last over trapping the batsman lbw. Taking the Nukarni total to 4/43 in the 8th over. A bowling change with The Hamburgler struggling to find some early rythym and spraying them a bit giving him a 10 ball over. Noah getting thrown the ball at the first change yielded immediate results, getting a wicket. James was replaced with Tuna after he had copped a bit of stick and the keeper let a couple go. Tuna was straight into it, the elite spray he gave the batsman was very enjoyable. Captain Max got his first ever run out in the 12th over taking the home side to 6/71. Noah claimed another scalp in his second over when the batsman tickled it through to the keeper. That was the end of any more celebrations with the game being merely academic with the home team needing 18 runs off 6 overs. They managed to make the runs with 3 overs to bowl. A big disappointment was the second highest run scorer for Nukarni was "Extras", yielding 25 runs.


A genuine Captain's knock 60

#### **Community Update**

#### Mt Holland Road Update

Good progress continues on the road upgrade project, in partnership with the WA Government and Decmil Group. After a brief winter pause in sealing, work resumed in October, while preparatory and maintenance work continued throughout the winter period.

#### Here's what's been happening:

- · As of mid-November, an additional 20km of road has been sealed.
- We're on track to seal another 30km before Christmas.
- A new sealed intersection is now complete on Parkers Range Road, south of Emu Fence Road.
- In December, we'll start sealing work at the Moorine Rock end of Parkers Range Road.
- The intersection works at Parkers Range Road and Marvel Loch Forrestania Road is now completed, and half sealed.

Construction works will temporarily shut down for Christmas from 19 December 2024, with site activity recommencing on 3 January 2025. Over this period, a maintenance crew will be on site to handle safety and reactionary works only.

The road upgrades are on schedule to be completed prior to winter 2025.

## Pioneers of Pilgarn

#### Stage 1.

#### Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

**Murphy family:** Felix and Anne and nine children moved in from Golden Valley to Southern Cross when the town was in its infancy. Felix had been employed at the Golden Valley pub. While he returned to collect another load, his wife and daughter selected a site to build a store which later became lot 9 when the town was surveyed. Felix was surprised to see his shop nearly completed by willing helpers when he returned, such being the power of females in a predominantly male town.

A much needed boarding house was built at the rear to provide a home from home for miners. While Felix and his son operated a carrying business, his wife and daughters ran the shop and boarding house. The daughters found husbands with one daughter giving birth to the first child born at Southern Cross. Felix was an inaugural councillor when the Municipality was formed. He was also appointed leader of the first convoy of wagons leaving for Coolgardie when it was discovered in 1892, followed by dozens of walkers who paid to have their gear carted on the wagons.


His son drove the first coach with two men in front cutting the track as they went. Mrs Murphy and daughter followed with a dray loaded with goods, having the honour of being the first white females into Coolgardie, where they set up a shop. The family did not lose their ties with Southern Cross for some years, afterwards retiring to Leederville.


