

#### NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO MAKE A LOCAL LAW

Pursuant to Section 3.5 of the Local Government Act, the Council of the Shire of Yilgarn resolved at its Ordinary Council Meeting on 21 November 2024 that it proposes to make the following local laws:

#### A) Public Places, Local Government Property and Trading Local Law 2025

PURPOSE: To regulate the care, control and management of all property of the local government.

EFFECT: To control the use of local government property. Some activities are permitted only

under a permit or under a determination and some activities are restricted or prohibited. Offences are created for inappropriate behaviour in or on local government

property.

#### B) Removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Materials Local Law 2025

PURPOSE: To make provisions about the removal of Refuse, Rubbish and Disused Materials. EFFECT: To allow the local government to manage untidy and unsightly properties more

efficiently.

#### C) Bush Fire Brigade Local Law 2025

PURPOSE: To make provisions about the organisation, establishment, maintenance and equipment

of bush fire brigades.

EFFECT: To align existing Local Laws with changes in the law and operational practice.

A copy of the proposed local laws may be inspected at or obtained from the Shire's administration office at 23 Antares Street, Southern Cross, between 8:30am and 4:30pm, Monday to Friday, and at the Southern Cross Library located at the Community Resource Centre during normal opening times. # Share what living in the Wheatbelt is like with doctors of the future

One hundred medical students will be coming to the Wheatbelt in March 2025.

During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and participate in community activities.

We need you to provide real-life experiences that will give them an understanding of what it is like to live in the Wheatbelt and perhaps inspire them to become rural doctors.

The students will visit the following towns:

- Bruce Rock
- Cunderdin
- Kellerberrin
- Merredin
- Narrogin
- Southern Cross
- Tammin
- Westonia

As a host, we will ask you to provide accommodation for two or three students, to assist with transporting them to/from town, and share what it is like to live in your town with the students. You are invited to come along to a Thank You Dinner with the students on the Thursday night.

#### Why host?

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life or the Wheatbelt.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are:

- · more likely to explore rural career opportunities; and
- better able to provide patient-centred care to rural people.

Some students, who have previously been hosted through this program, continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs, some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine, and numerous students are now doctors in the Wheatbelt and other parts of rural/remote WA and Australia.

# Rain Rodenburg: Embracing Opportunities and Supporting Students in Merredin

Rain Rodenburg, Lumen's Study Hubs Coordinator in Merredin, brings a unique perspective to her role, shaped by her background in education and cultural exchange. Born and raised in the Netherlands, Rain explains, "We don't have school buses. We all cycle to school. We don't have school uniforms. Our high school days are longer, starting at 8.15am and they vary in length depending on how many periods you have in a day. We can have 8 periods in a day, finishing at 4pm. In Winter, you'd cycle to school in the dark and cycle home again in the dark!"

Rain's journey to Australia began in 2008 when she did an exchange semester at the University of New South Wales in Sydney. "I just fell in love with Australia, the climate, the lifestyle, the laid-back attitude," she recalls. After returning home to complete her Master's in Communication at the University of Amsterdam, Rain decided to go on another Australian adventure, this time exploring the West Coast and having a go at station life, mustering cattle, goats and sheep. Eventually Rain settled in Merredin and decided to pursue a Graduate Diploma in Education at Edith Cowan University.

Rain faced a significant challenge with the IELTS (International English Language Testing System) test required for students with a non-English education background. "It was extremely challenging. I was just half a point short in the writing section. It really knocked my confidence." Determined to succeed, Rain engaged in focused IELTS preparation and passed on her third attempt. "Once I understood the writing structure they were looking for, it was fine. The experience made me more resilient and improved my writing skills."

Rain is passionate about supporting students who face similar challenges. "I love being able to support students through their studies, especially knowing how hard it can be to balance everything," she says. "If Lumen had been around when I was studying, I could've stayed in Merredin and it would've saved me so much time, money, and stress."

Rain's advice to students considering further education is simple: "Give it a go. If there's something you're passionate about, don't hesitate to pursue it. It may be challenging, but there's support here at Lumen, and we're happy to help you on your education journey."



Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Parker, William: Parker came to Southern Cross in 1888 looking for pastoral country, and instead found gold. He was guided to the spot by his aboriginal guide who said there was a mountain of the stuff where he was born, and led him to Parkers Range 30 miles south of Southern Cross. Parker worked his lease for a number of years and became a leading citizen in the town of Parkers Range which bore his name. He rewarded his faithful native by building 'a white fella railing' around his brother's grave. Parker was quite vocal through the newspapers on how the country should be run, his brother being a politician. Parker was a true pioneer who helped open up the inland of WA.
