ACTIVITIES & EVENTS

Seniors Exercises. The twice weekly exercise sessions continue to be popular, with numbers remaining steady.

First Monday Craft Group & Third Monday Knitting Group: Numbers at these activities fluctuate quite widely, however there is a strong core of people who attend each session, and it was gratifying to see garments knitted at our group entered into the Ag Show, and winning awards.

Knitted Knockers: We had eight knitters sign up to knit prosthetics for people who have recently undergone mastectomies. However three have pulled out, but other community members have stepped up and taken on the additional kits.

Junk Art Competition: Response to date has been slow, with only a few local people enquiring about the competition, and one from outside the area.

2015 Partnership and Sustainability Forum: I attended this two day forum in Perth with Monica Fairless.

Day 1 concentrating mainly on the subjects Contracts and Sustainability was facilitated by Scott Robinson, Director of Jack in the Box, a marketing and communication company located in the South West.

Leveraging your Assets: The first speaker was Alan Piper who has led diverse services as Director General and CEO, leading major change programs and significant infrastructure developments. Alan presented on "Levering your Assets – building on your strengths". Alan discussed different methods for problem solving, and how to determine the relationships between external and internal customers.

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The "Waste Factory" was discussed, and the fact business costs include 20% of waste through errors, reworking, not returning phone calls, dysfunctional teams and lost business. It was advised we regularly review the services we offer, and were also given a tool for reviewing services and activities currently offered.

It was pointed out the smaller we are the harder it is to get leverage.

Community Resource Network Evaluation Project: DRD have contracted Professor John Phillimore from Curtin and his team. Results will be used by DRD to build a business case to take to Cabinet. Results will also influence DRD in drawing up contracts which are expected to have room for adjustment. 40% of CRCs will be visited by the evaluation team, Southern Cross is not on the list of CRCs to be visited.

Linkwest: have recently partnered with the CR Network and gave a brief overview of the services they will be able to offer individual CRCs.

Jobs Australia: Presented by Michael Pegg. In the past there has been much discussion within the Network about which awards CRC would be paid under. This very informative session outlined awards and recent changes. This did not affect Southern Cross CRC as Shire Admin Staff are paid under a different award. The session was followed by a clinic available to all CRCs requiring further support.

Day 2 before lunch saw a number of elective workshops. Monica and I opted to participate in separate workshops.

Managing Stakeholder Relationships: this workshop was presented by Hannah Fitzhardinge, whose professional expertise includes leadership, management, government and stakeholder engagement, change management, employee engagement and community partnerships and relations. Hannah outlined the importance of managing stakeholders, especially when an action or services of ours could appear to be of a negative impact on others.

Planning local initiatives with an outcomes focus: presented by the Department of Finance Funding and Contracting Team. Participants were broken up into groups with a member of the finance team with each group. The group I was part of participated in devising a program for the Pingrup CRC designed to foster interest and engage with the youth of that town.

Day 2's afternoon program started with the return of Scott Robinson. The four styles of communications were discussed, and CRC delegates were given the chance to discuss / clarify questions and comments they would like to put to Minister Terry Redman who joined the forum at 1:30 for a Q & A session before CRC delegates were given the chance to mix and mingle with Minister Redman at Afternoon Tea.

- 1) Talga Resources Ltd has submitted an application for Exploration Licence E77/2315 which is located north of Bullfinch overlaying a number of properties and including sections of Reserve 30445 Lot 1478 "Timber", Reserve 1434 Lot 350 "Water", and Reserve 17390 Lot 1509 "Water & Parklands". This Licence includes sections of the Bullfinch-Evanston Road, Bullfinch Withers Find North Road and Pringle Road. There is also a Shire gravel pit located within this Licence.

- 3) Talga Resources Ltd has submitted an application for Prospecting Licence P77/4328 which is located north of Hopes Hill mine and townsite, west of the Koorda-Southern Cross Road, and is located within Reserve 19386 "Mining". This Licence includes a small section of Parker Road.

Comment

Under the Mining Act any works within a gazetted townsite or within 2Kms of the boundary of a gazetted townsite requires comment from the Local Government. In these instances, the proposed drilling operations will be well outside any designated townsite, and there may be proposed drilling operations along the road reserves within the exploration licence areas. The abovementioned roads are all controlled by the Shire.

In line with similar applications previously received from other applicants, Council should grant approval to each applicant to carry out any roadside drilling based on the following general conditions:-
