





# Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans Operations Policy



- 1.1 The use or operation of any engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery is prohibited within a paddock or lot, if the paddock or lot contains crop or pasture. This includes driving on roads/tracks that pass through such paddocks or lots;
- 1.2 The use or operation of any engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery within 5 metres of a paddock or lot referred to in item 1.1 of this policy is prohibited;
- 1.3 Off-road activity is prohibited.

#### **Definitions**

- Off-road Activity: Has the meaning applied under the Bush Fires Regulations 1954, and generally means, the use or operation of any engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery on land on which there is bush or which is under crop or pasture or stubble.
- Engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery: means any engine, motor vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery that is, or that is activated by, an internal combustion engine.
- Crop: means a plant that is grown in large quantities, especially as food.
- Pasture: means land covered with grass or other vegetation that is suitable for feeding animals on.



## **EXEMPTIONS**



Vehicles carting water for stock is exempt, on the provision it is in the best interests of animal welfare, and a minimum of 600L remains in the vessel at all times and is able to be readily applied in the event of a fire;



The use or operation of any engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery within road reserves are exempt, on the provision the use is not likely to cause a fire;

Please note, the provisions for a declared Total Fire Ban take precedence over these exemptions.



## **RESTRICTED & PROHIBITED BURNING PERIODS**

## **FACT SHEET**

## Can I have a campfire during **Restricted Burning Periods?**



You can have a small camp fire for camping and cooking purposes during the Restricted Burning Period, however you must ensure that the campfire is completely extinguished prior to leaving your camp site and please monitor the camp fire to ensure it is controlled while it

Enclosed gas appliances are permitted during both Restricted and Prohibited Burning Periods, as long as they are used as per manufacturers instructions, and are used in a safe manner.

## Harvest & Vehicle Movement **Bans and Total Fire Bans**

Harvest & Vehicle Movement Bans are imposed by each individual Local Government Area. Notifications are sent out via the Shire's Whispir SMS system, and available on the Emergency Information Hotline 9487



Total Fire Bans are imposed by DFES, and the provisions for a declared Total Fire Ban take precedence over any Harvest & Vehicle Movement Ban Exemptions.

Total Fire Bans can restrict use of certain machinery and/or equipment - make sure you know what you can use, visit www.dfes.wa.gov.au/hazard-information/bushfire/total-fire-ban

## Can I burn garden refuse?



The burning of garden refuse on the ground is NOT PERMITTED during the Restricted and Prohibited Burning Times, being from the 19th September through to 31st March, throughout the Yilgarn District.

## Am I able to burn off?

Burning is NOT PERMITTED on any Sunday during the Restricted Burning Period.

- · Permits to burn during the Restricted Burning Period are required, and must be obtained from a Fire Control Officer.
- · Permits to burn stubble from the previous seasons crop will not be issued until 1 March.



Burning is NOT PERMITTED any time during the Prohibited Burning Period.

## Can I have a campfire during **Prohibited Burning Periods?**



The lighting or use of fire in the open air for camping and cooking purposes is NOT PERMITTED during the Prohibited Burning Period, being 1st November to 15th February, throughout the Yilgarn district.

Enclosed gas appliances are permitted during both Restricted and Prohibited Burning Periods, as long as they are used as per manufacturers instructions, and are used in a safe manner.

## THE GAZETTED RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING TIMES FOR **EACH YEAR ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

Restricted Burning Period: 19 September to 31 October and 16 February to 31 March

## Prohibited Burning Period: 1 November to 15 February

In accordance with Sections 17 and 18 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, Council may, if it considers that seasonal conditions warrant a variation of the prohibited or restricted burning times in its district, vary the prohibited or restricted burning times in respect of that year in the district or a part of

shortening, extending, suspending or reimposing a period of prohibited or restricted burning times; or
 imposing a further period of prohibited or restricted burning times.
 This variation cannot exceed more than 14 successive days.

In accordance with Sections 17 (10) and 18 (5) (c) of the Bush Fires Act 1954, Council delegates to the Shire President and the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, jointly its powers and duties to vary Prohibited and Restricted Burning Times, in accordance with the Bush Fires Act 1954, as highlighted in this Policy.

## The Community Funding Program is currently open for applications in the 25/26 funding round.

- · To provide a source of funding for non-profit community organisations operating within the district.
- To assist community organisations in maximising their future development.
- To provide an impartial means by which community organisations can access Council funds.

## Applications for the following categories are invited:



### **Essential equipment** /capital items (up to \$2,000)

Types of essential equipment:

- Ground maintenance equipment
- Sporting equipment
- Office equipment
- Minor plant equipment
- Minor building works

#### Community / Sporting Event related expenses (up to \$2,000)

Funding is available for event related expenses to help cover for, but not limited to, quest speakers, facilitators and other event hire costs. Written quotes must be provided at the time of application.

#### **Training & Travel Assistance for** local officials/office bearers (up to \$500)

Funding is available to officials and/or office bearers of community organisations who are required to attend regional / state association organised seminars / courses / meetings as part of their duties. Knowledge gained at these activities must then be used to assist the local community organisation in its continued development.

## Eligibility

To be eligible the applicant must be based in the Shire of Yilgarn and meet the following criteria:

- · Funding is available for activities which will provide benefits directly to the people of the Shire of Yilgarn.
- · Only non-profit community organisations operating within the Shire of Yilgarn are eligible to apply.
- · Organisations that have failed to acquit funding from the last round by 30 June 2025 will not be eligible for this round of the funding program.





## Pioneers of Pilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

**Stacey, Jack:** Came to Southern Cross in 1895 and got a job as lamplighter and odd job man for the Municipality. In 1910 he took over running the electricity powerhouse which he worked every day of the week, being commended frequently for his dedication to the job.

Afterwards, he developed a farm near town and became the third largest farmer. He bred the best horses in the district. As a measure of his care for stock, the RSPCA made Jack Stacey honoury veterinarian for this area.

He was civic minded and for 18 years served as a town councillor, the last term as Chairman. His specialty was the powerhouse, and Southern Cross can thank Jack Stacey for its continued electricity, particularly as the town was too small to make it viable.

Jack tells the story of coming over the hill into Southern Cross, and vowing to move on within 6 months. Instead he remained for the rest of his life.


