MobileMuster is the telecommunications industry's product stewardship program. It is accredited by the federal government and is 100% carbon neutral.

What we do

- Provide a **free and secure recycling program** for mobile phones & accessories, and other e-waste such as modems, landline phones, smart home tech and wearables.
- Ensure the recycling program meets the **highest environmental standard**.
- Provide a collection network of **thousands of drop-off points** Australia-wide.
- Partner with charities to **incentivise consumers** to recycle.
- Raise awareness of **reuse options** and recycling of unused mobile phones, as well as a range of e-waste.

How we do it

- Major handset manufacturers and network carriers voluntarily fund the program to enable a free recycling scheme for Australians.
- Partner with councils, retail stores, repair stores, schools, and other organisations to ensure an accessible network, there is a MobileMuster drop-off point within 10km for most of the Australian population.
- Offer rewards and recognition to top collecting sites to encourage greater recycling.
- Roll out annual campaigns as well as an 'always on' social media activity to build trust in the program, promote our partners, and educate consumers about the benefits of recycling.




Why we do it


Recycling our end-of-life mobile phones keeps these products out of landfill and maximises resource recovery.

- **Reduce** the need to extract and use raw materials, saving our natural resources in the process.

MobileMuster recycles everything collected through the program; nothing is reused or resold. Any data left on phones is destroyed during the recycling process.

Recycle the right way.

Tackling frequently asked questions

What happens to mobile phones collected for recycling?

Mobile phones, accessories, and other accepted e-waste by MobileMuster are transported to one of two recycling facilities in Sydney and Melbourne. Products are dismantled manually with components separated into streams – circuit boards, metal, glass, plastics, and batteries.

Some plastics and metals are processed in Australia. Circuit boards, batteries, and other plastics are processed by our global e-waste recycler in their facility in Singapore. These materials are recovered and used in the manufacture of a range of products, including mobile phones, glass bottles, recycled plastic park benches, other electronics, mobile phone batteries, and jewellery.

None of the mobile phones we collect are reused or resold.

What happens to the data that may still be on a phone when it's recycled?

Consumers are encouraged to delete or transfer data they want to keep from the device before dropping it off for recycling, and MobileMuster offers guides on how to do this on our website.

However, any data left on the phone is completely destroyed during the recycling process.

If a mobile phone contains so many precious metals, including gold and silver, is MobileMuster making money off the phones we drop off?

No. MobileMuster is a not-for-profit program and continues to invest millions of dollars to enhance the scheme. The monetary value of materials recovered from phones to-date is in fact, a fraction of what has been spent on collecting, processing and promoting the scheme.

Do mobile phones end up in developing countries for recycling and how does MobileMuster ensure that recycling occurs at the highest environmental standard?

Everything collected through the MobileMuster program is dismantled in Australia. Some materials are processed and recycled in Australia, while others are done overseas, including Singapore, where there is the appropriate infrastructure, capacity, and market demand.

MobileMuster believes in transparency and accountability, so we ensure that our recycling partner maintains the relevant accreditation and regular audits are conducted on the recycling process.

What your partnership with MobileMuster offers

MobileMuster supports our retail partners and repair stores with:

- Free collection units;
- Free pick-up and recycling service;
- Access to promotional resources including posters and stickers;
- Annual recycling certificates; and
- Participation in our rewards program that honours high achieving collectors.

All you need to know about running a collection point

Collecting MobileMuster electronic waste

- All registered stores have a site ID which is used when booking in pick-ups.
- Promotional resources can be downloaded from our website.
- Collection units should be visible and in a secure location in your shop where it can be monitored by staff.
- Once you unit is full, book a pick-up at bookings.mobilemuster.com.au
- You can order MobileMuster shipping boxes on the MobileMuster [website](http://mobilemuster.com.au).

Booking in a collection

- Complete the online [booking form](#) which will require your site ID, and order your fire-resistant transport bag and shipping box. They will arrive in 1-3 days.
- **Box** all items up (up to 20kg per box), ensuring nothing can fall out during transporting and by following our [packing guidelines](#). Do not include damaged, swollen, or leaking batteries.
- Click the link in your inbox to book the pickup. Once your booking has been confirmed you will receive labels from MobileMuster. Print the labels and attach them to each box.

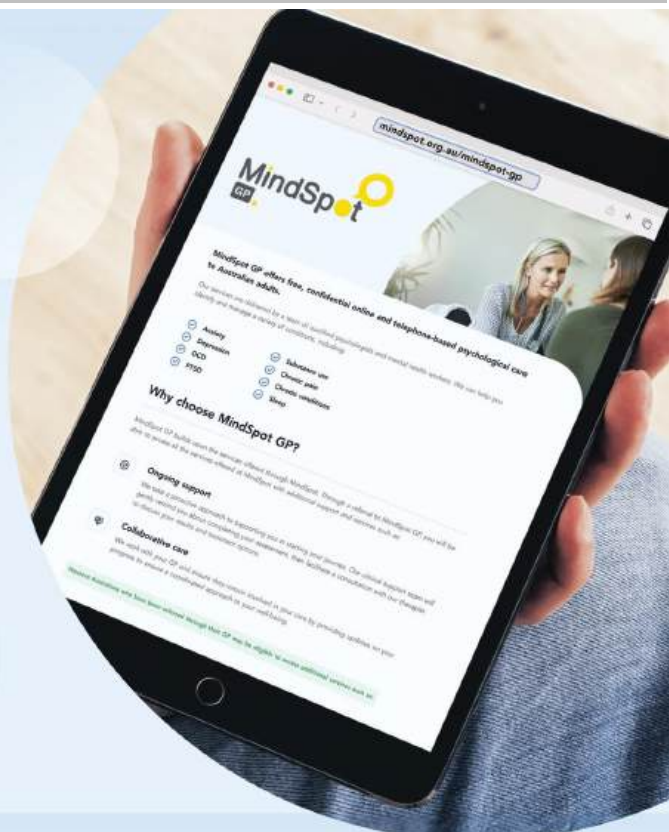

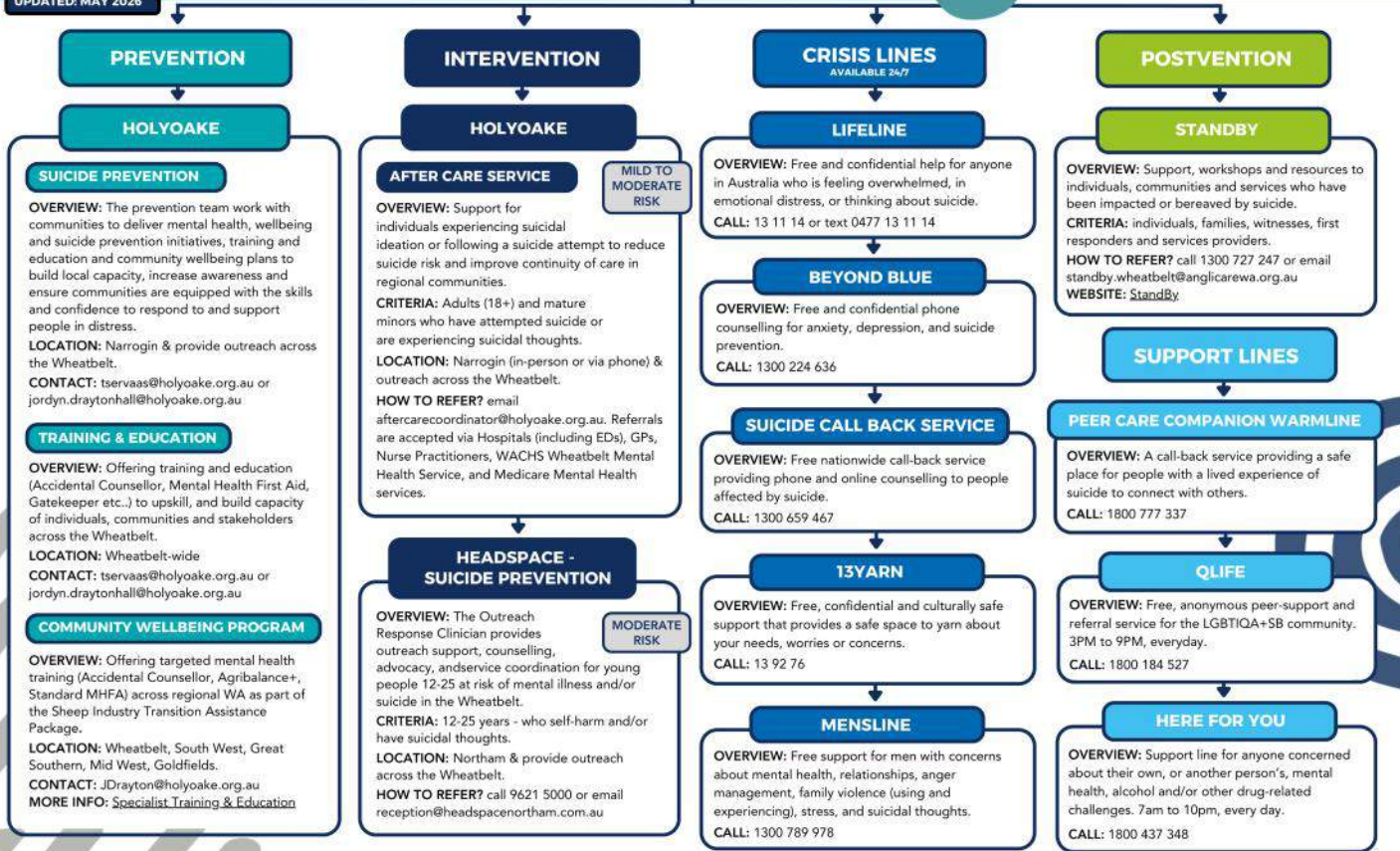

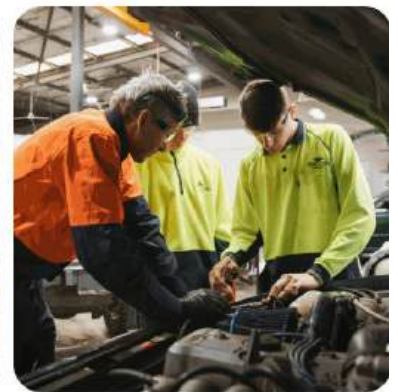

The Story of Bullant McIntyre (continued)

The criticism got too much for Frank. He resigned as Mayor but was talked into re-nominating where he won mayorship uncontested. This led to a further serve of vitriol:

....Some weeks ago we saw fit to show that F H Snook was a sniveller and unfit to occupy the mayoral chair. In consequence the Mad Mayor resigned from office. He did not say he desired to stand again or that he wished to contest the seat against anybody else. He merely sniggered and whined like a weak creature that he is. To some people he said he resigned for the purpose of suing this paper for slander, insinuating that he would sue the proprietor. He cackled for some days and then went on a different tack, hinting that it would be useless as the proprietor had nothing. Perhaps the sniveller will writ us if we give him our assurance the paper is not and never has been either mortgaged or held under a bill of sale. We invite Sniveller to fire away. When Snivelling Snook resigned, this editor went to Perth, and on returning found that Snook had again nominated for the mayoralty, and had been returned without a contest. On the strength of this Sniveller got drunk and boasted of having scored a victory over a man who he was afraid to challenge, either by pen, vulgar fists, or at the ballot box. He got a bit elated, and converted his pub into a bedlam, and showed in addition to being a sniveller, he was a fool and keeper of a house of questionable repute. If F H Snook still thinks he is the idol of Southern Cross we hereby challenge him to resign and contest the Mayoralty with the editor of this newspaper. We do not want any sneaking or funny business but a fair and square appeal to the intelligence of the ratepayers. If the ratepayers prefer a sniveller to a man who has consistently fought for the Yilgarn we should be very much surprised.'

There was no let up from the paper. Snook, as mayor was automatically a Justice of the Peace, which meant serving his turn on the Bench:

....Snivelling Snook has no right to sit on the bench on Monday to deal with his Sunday night customers brought before him as drunk and disorderly. He sells liquor all day creating drunks; that is bad enough, but to sit on the sacred judgement chair on Monday and letting his clients down lightly with small fines. The Sniveller's house is famous for Sunday trading and it is time for the press to enter protest – Snook must either get out of his groggery or keep off the bench.'

A new style vitriol followed:

....The mayor of this town keeps a pub and also a cow. One day last week the barmaids of an opposition boozery had a lot of pretty pretties hanging on the clothesline. The mayor's cow with malice afterthought calmly walked along the line of unmentionables and devoured the lot. Some declare the mayor sooled his cow onto the garments, if this is the case he should be ashamed of himself.'

Snook served four terms as Mayor as an indication of his popularity. As the Municipality kept functioning he must have done a reasonable job. It was a difficult task as Southern Cross did not have sufficient population to support the expenditure needed for both a Road Board and a Municipality. The Municipality would slowly go broke and eventually be absorbed by its sister body, the Yilgarn Roads Board.

At the end of 1909, Snook decided he would not stand for re-election as mayor. Long-time protagonist Archie McIntyre saw his chance to become mayor and contested the position. He tied votes with John Chadwick, and the ballot was decided by Mayor Snook's casting vote. The Sunday Times gleefully reported events as follows:

....Southern Cross mayoral elections resulted in a tie. Bullant McIntyre and a peaceful butcher named Chadwick secured 72 votes apiece. Whereupon the Mayor, who has been pilloried for years as Snivelling Snook in Mac's paper, and had the dumps of vituperation heaped upon him, gave his casting vote to Chadwick.'

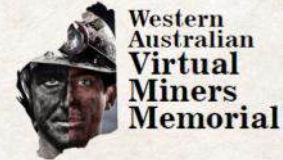
