# **Background:**

# Background

It is proposed to impose Differential Rates for the year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 2017 under the various rating categories within the Shire of Yilgarn.

Under Section 6.33 (3) of the Local Government Act 1995, a Local Government is not, without the approval of the Minister, to impose a differential general rate which is more than twice the lowest differential general rate imposed by it.

With the Differential General Rates proposed in the 2016/2017 Budget, as has been the practice in previous years, Council falls under the umbrella of this section of the Act. Note however that it is only applicable this year to UV Mining. Accordingly, Ministerial approval is required and the proposal to impose this rate must be advertised for a period of not less than 21 days.

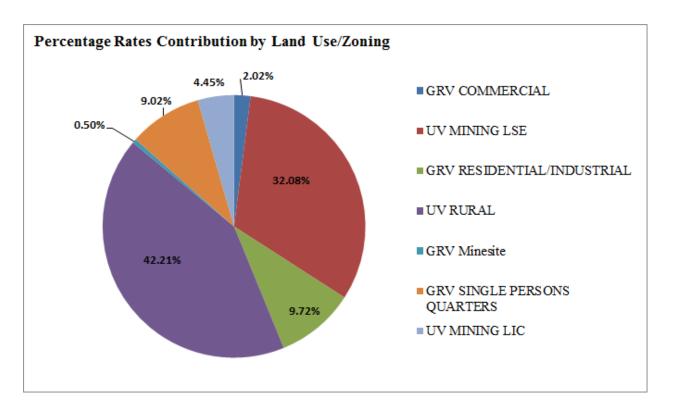
# Proposed Differential Rates

There were several factors taken into consideration when setting the proposed Differential Rates:

- 1. In 2013/14 both GRV Residential/Industrial and GRV Commercial an increase of 3% in the *rate in the dollar* took effect. Also in 2013/14 Gross Rental Values for both Residential/Industrial and Commercial increased with the *latter experiencing a lower overall increase*. Subsequently GRV Residential/Industrial made a larger dollar contribution. This inequity has been addressed with the proposed 6% increase for Commercial in 2016/17 compared to 3% increase for Residential/Industrial;
- 2. Rate in the dollar for GRV Mine-sites and SPQ's have been reduced from 2015/16 to a level now comparable to the State average bringing greater equity to the Shires mining companies. Additionally the proposed rate is no more than twice the lowest rate in its category and hence is now compliant with the Act;
- 3. UV Rural has been increased 6% to redress inequity similar to that seen in 2013/14 with GRV Residential and GRV Commercial. The increase to the rate in the dollar for UV Rural in 2012/13 did not account for the land valuation changes that decrease unimproved values;
- 4. UV Mining has been reduced to further assist mining companies cope with rate burdens during difficult economic times; and
- 5. Ensuring all objectives of both the Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan are incorporated.

There were also several factors considered when setting the proposed minimum rates.

- 1. An increase to \$500 for GRV Residential/Industrial is to discourage holding undeveloped land within the Town, which reduces the amenity of the area, and thereby encourages development.
- 2. The UV Mining category has been split into two groups Leases and Licenses. The Leases minimum has been increased to ensure that the rate burden is distributed equitably between all property owners. A lesser minimum has been applied to exploration and prospecting to provide relief to small tenement owners.

# **Summary**

The advertising requirement for the proposal to impose Differential Rates will be carried out on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May 2016, with submissions to be received by 4pm on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> June 2016. The final determination of Rates in the Dollar will not be made until the Draft Budget committee meeting at a date yet to be determined.

# **Background**

In accordance with Councils 2015/2016 Ten Year Plant Replacement Program quotations were invited through WALGA'S Preferred Supply Contract to supply and deliver one only multi tyre roller and to trade Councils current Ammann AP 240 Multi Tyred Roller.

A monetary allocation of \$185,000 for the outright purchase of a new roller and an income value of \$35,000 (trade of existing roller) allowed for in the 2015/2016 Financial Year Budget for this vehicle.

The proposed trade roller is one of two multi tyred rollers Council owns. Their primary functions are to assist with achieving maximum compaction on bitumen sealing works, major road upgrades, gravel sheeting and maintenance works on council's road network.

As it can be seen from the above summary the operating weight of the rollers quoted on, range from 18,400kg to 21,000kg ballast with water and steel. The two current rollers that council is running have an operating weight of 18,550kg ballast with water and steel.

The changeover cost of \$185,460 submitted by Westrac for the Caterpillar CW34NN Roller is the highest received but has a superior warranty offer of 84 months/4000hrs whichever comes first. This warranty offer sounds impressive but generally the rollers accumulate between 1250/1300 machine hours per year, thus achieving 3500/4000hrs within three and a half to four years making the eighty four month offer redundant.

The lowest changeover quotation received is from Atlas Corpo Group for the Dynapac CP2700 (\$142,575), with a ballast operating weight of 20,500kgs.
