Background:

The Yilgarn Local Action Group (LAG), through the Shire of Yilgarn, has acquired a new works utility under a lease agreement. As a result of this the LAG has a 2012 Hilux SR/5 Dual Cab Utility surplus to requirements.

As the vehicle is owned by the Shire of Yilgarn and has a value exceeding \$20,000 there is a requirement under the local government act to invite tenders for the sale.

Tenders have been advertised and close on Monday 20 June 2016. Rather than wait until the July ordinary Council meeting this report requests Council delegate authority to the Chief Executive Officer to accept the tender that is most beneficial to the Shire.

Statutory Environment

3.58. Disposing of property

(1) In this section — dispose includes to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of, whether absolutely or not; property includes the whole or any part of the interest of a local government in property, but does not include money.

(2) Except as stated in this section, a local government can only dispose of property to —

(a) the highest bidder at public auction; or

(b) the person who at public tender called by the local government makes what is, in the opinion of the local government, the most acceptable tender, whether or not it is the highest tender.

(3) A local government can dispose of property other than under subsection (2) if, before agreeing to dispose of the property —

(a) it gives local public notice of the proposed disposition —

(i) describing the property concerned; and

(ii) giving details of the proposed disposition; and

(iii) inviting submissions to be made to the local government before a date to be specified in the notice, being a date not less than 2 weeks after the notice is first given; and

(b) it considers any submissions made to it before the date specified in the notice and, if its decision is made by the council or a committee, the decision and the reasons for it are recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which the decision was made.

5.42. Delegation of some powers and duties to CEO

(1) A local government may delegate* to the CEO the exercise of any of its powers or the discharge of any of its duties under —

(a) this Act other than those referred to in section 5.43; or

(b) the Planning and Development Act 2005 section 214(2), (3) or (5).

* Absolute majority required.

Background

At its meeting held on Thursday 17th March 2016 Council resolved as follows:

"That Council propose the following Differential General Rates for the year ending 30th June 2017

Land Category	Proposed Rate	Proposed Minimum Rate

In setting these proposed rates Council considered the key values of objectivity, fairness and equity, consistency, transparency and administrative efficiency.

Council differentiates general rates based on land use. For 2016/17 it is proposed to retain current Land categories except for the UV Mining category which will be split into two groups – Leases and Licenses. The purpose of the split is to provide greater fairness and equity to small tenement owners engaged only in exploration and prospecting and as such a lesser minimum of \$300 has been applied to UV Mining License.

The object of the proposed rate for each category is to ensure the proportion raised is consistent as possible with previous years. This is stated in the 'Objects and Reasons to Impose Differential Rates for 2016/17' – see attachment 1.

The Objects and Reasons are based on Council's Annual Budget process which includes a review of its expenditure and efficiencies. For the upcoming 2016/17 financial year the following measures have been undertaken:

- Reducing employee costs e.g. number of hours needed to clean offices and facilities;
- Reducing Administration overheads e.g. telecommunications, utilities, consultancy etc.
- Reducing or removing maintenance costs on those buildings not delivering levels of service identified as strategic in Council's Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan; and

Implementing a digital infrastructure and software program to take advantage of the upcoming National Broadband Network technology.

The Corporate Business Plan 2013/14 to 2016/17 and Long Term Financial Plan 2013/14 to 2022/23 have assumed rate increases of 6% p.a. Last year this was not practical due to the economic environment however for 2016/17 it is proposed that UV Rural and UV Commercial increase by 6% p.a. As outlined in Council minutes (33/2016) for March 2016 equity and fairness is the principle underlying this increase.

Additionally the proposed rate for UV Mining has been reduced from \$0.1805 in 2015/16 to \$0.1705 in 2016/17 – this measure will further assist mining companies cope with a rate burden during difficult economic times. Notably though the rate is more than twice the lowest rate for the UV category and therefore forms the basis of an application to the Minister for approval.

Importantly the rate in the dollar for GRV Mine-sites and GRV Single Persons Quarters have both been reduced by 31% from 2015/16 levels - now comparable to the State average bringing greater equity to the Shires mining companies. Additionally the proposed rate is no more than twice the lowest rate in its category and hence is now compliant with the Act.

Comment

Public notice of the proposed rates was given on 18 May in both 'The West Australian' and 'The Kalgoorlie Miner' – see attachment 2.

With 21 days for submissions to be received by 4pm Wednesday 8th June there has been no correspondence received by the CEO's office. Additionally per requirements of the Local Government Act notice must be given on the Shire Office Administration Board and Library Notice Board – this was done on Monday 23rd May. With 21 days for submissions to be received by 4pm Wednesday 15th June at time of writing this report there were no submissions received.

Additionally on the 16th May the CEO informed the following ratepayers in writing of Council's Proposal to impose Differential Rates:

- Council rates are a property tax and accordingly, as with all government taxes, are not based on services received by individual tax payers.
