What are the health benefits of yoga?

Dozens of scientific trials of varying quality have been published on yoga. While there's scope for more rigorous studies on yoga's health benefits, most studies suggest that yoga is a safe and effective way to increase physical activity, especially strength, flexibility and balance. There's some evidence that regular yoga practice is beneficial for people with high blood pressure, heart disease, aches and pains, including low back pain, depression and stress.

Am I too old for yoga?

Definitely not. People often start yoga in their 70s and often say they wish they had started sooner. There are yoga classes for every age group. Yoga is a form of exercise that can be enjoyed from childhood to your advanced years. Do I have to be fit to do yoga?

No, you can join a class that's suitable for your fitness level. For example, to join a mixed ability yoga class, you need to be able to get up and down from the floor. Some yoga classes are chair-based.

Don't I need to be flexible to do yoga?

Not necessarily. Yoga will improve your flexibility and help you go beyond your normal range of movement, so that you then feel more comfortable during normal daily activity.

Pioneers of Pilgarn

Yilgarn timeline (continued)

1907

- Council installs its own electric plant for town use after falling out with Frasers mine.
- Bicycle pads put down to outlying settlements of Greenmount, Kennyvale, and Hopes Hill
- SX telephone exchange opens with 14 subscribers.

1908

- Football match in SX abandoned due to players being more interested in fighting than playing.
- Several cases of diphtheria confirmed. School drain blamed.
- Mining in Marvel Loch district in full swing. Township laid out.

1909

- Croquet Club now has lawn and electric light. Fire Brigade forms own football team.
- Senior Cadet Corp formed, in addition to school cadets. Rifles and ammo free.
- Cricket pitch made of cement taken from Deeming's house, intended for next victim.

1910

- Charlie Jones names his new find Bullfinch after birds in the area. A rush is on.
- Tom Riseley, the discoverer of Southern Cross, dies in a Perth hospital.
- Local aborigines come into town to collect their annual blanket quota.

1911

- SX benefits from being the gateway to Bullfinch and also Marvel Loch.
- Another room added to the courthouse for mining business due to Bullfinch boom.
- Powerhouse engine replaced with producer gas. Larger plant needed due to town growth 1912
- New shops at Bullfinch and Marvel Loch are impacting on business once done at SX.
- Goldfields Water Supply assumes control of town retic scheme once done by Council
- Now three banks and three police stations in Yilgarn. Rly and water extended to Bullfinch

Texting whilst driving is dangerous!

Turn off your mobile phone before driving.

Driver distraction is the diversion of attention away from driving toward a competing activity. It has been identified as an emerging road safety issue and is ranked by road safety authorities around the world as a significant contributing factor to road trauma.

While there are numerous causes for driver distraction, 'use of a mobile phone whilst driving' and 'use of a television in a vehicle that is visible to the driver' are driving offences in WA, with penalties of a \$400 fine and 3 demerit points.

32% of all road crash deaths and serious injuries in WA between 2005 and 2007 were a result of distractions.

Despite 90% of WA drivers acknowledging the danger of texting while driving, 57%, still irregularly or regularly offend. Two seconds on your phone (whilst travelling at 60km/hour) is the same as 33 metres driving blind.

Research shows that being distracted when driving, such as by a mobile phone, increases the risk of a crash. Simply taking your eyes off the road for longer than two seconds, doubles the risk of a crash. A short lapse of concentration can have lifelong consequences.

The use of mobile phones when driving is well understood by the community, yet still prevalent in many drivers. This is a topic that has lots of promotional material; videos from around the world have dealt with this subject in creative ways. Combining of these three genes and allowing those farmers that want to use them will likely catapult the WA Wheatbelt back into prosperous times with 50% yield increases being very possible.

However, innovations in agriculture do not just happen. Always there are critics of new technology. To make innovations happen it takes determination, knowledge and courage to come together. In Parliament the gloves must come off to push back dishonest arguments – Bill has regularly proven that he can do this in order to renew Wheatbelt prosperity which will then flow through with employment and businesses that support the towns. Give Bill a chance to make your rural lifestyle prosperous again, Vote Bill Crabtree one this Saturday. If in doubt, ask your local farmers, most know him and his 35 year track record!


