

Welcome to our Flu Vaccination Program for 2017

We are pleased to advise that we have now received our Government funded influenza vaccines. If you would like to be vaccinated, please make an appointment at the practice on 9049 1147.

Who is eligible for free flu vaccinations?

The flu vaccine is free every year for:

- pregnant women (at any stage of pregnancy)
- people aged 65 years and over
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children aged 6 months to under 5 years (new age group added in 2016)
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people 15 years or older
- anyone older than 6 months with any of the following medical conditions:
 - heart disease
 - severe asthma, a long-term lung condition (e.g. cystic fibrosis)
 - long-term illness requiring medical treatment or hospitalisation the previous year
 - nervous system disorder (e.g. multiple sclerosis)
 - a weakened immune system
 - type 1 or type 2 diabetes
 - children aged 6 months to 10 years on long-term aspirin treatment.

Private influenza vaccinations:

We are offering private flu vaccines for a small cost to those who do not meet the above criteria, and also for those companies who wish to have their employees vaccinated. Please contact the practice on 9049 1147 for appointment scheduling.

Help to stop flu from spreading

Protecting yourself from getting the flu will also protect others from being infected. This is because the flu virus can spread very easily from one person to another, usually when someone infected with the virus sneezes or coughs, releasing droplets that contain the virus into the air. These droplets can be breathed in by others, or transferred to anyone who may touch a contaminated surface.

Good hygiene practices, such as washing your hands thoroughly with soap and warm water can also assist with reducing the risk of infection.




