Message from the Shire President



2017/18 Shire Budget

At the Council Meeting held on 22 June 2017 Council adopted a cash Budget for 2017/18 and this document will form the basis of the full statutory Budget which will be formerly adopted in July 2017.

I am very pleased to report that Council has agreed to keep rates unchanged in 2017/18 to what they were in 2016/17 (zero rate increase). This has been made possible due to a number of efficiency measures implemented during the year and I congratulate the CEO and Executive Staff for their efforts during the year to make this possible.

In addition to our normal service provision the Budget includes the following:

- ✓ From July 2017 the Shire has to pay full licensing and stamp duty on our plant and vehicles. These costs were previously exempt for local governments and will cost the Shire of Yilgarn approximately \$70,000 per annum.
- ✓ Two additional Independent Living Units. This is part of the CEACA initiative involving 11 local governments and due to grant funds received the two new units will cost the Shire \$20,000 each.
- ✓ Another \$350,000 has been set aside to go towards the redevelopment of the Southern Cross Swimming Pool. Council now has approx. \$1.3m in Reserve Funds for this project. Concept designs of the proposed redevelopment are on display in the Council Administration building and residents are encouraged to have a look and provide feedback.
- ✓ Council has again agreed to have free entry to the Southern Cross Swimming Pool for the 2017/18 pool season.
- \$62,000 for an Outdoor Fitness Centre at the Southern Cross Recreation Centre. This will be located next to the oval in the Ag Show undercover area. The Agriculture Show Committee has agreed for this open shed to be used for this purpose.
- \$248,000 for the laying of Asphalt along Antares Street in the CBD. The car parking areas will be red asphalt and this project will substantially improve our main street. This project also includes the realignment and asphalting of Great Eastern Highway and will include red asphalt for the intersection of Great Eastern Highway and Antares Street to highlight the main street to travellers through town.
- ✓ In addition to the above we will continue our road construction and maintenance program to ensure our roads remain the best in the Wheatbelt.

Gun amnesty to get illegal guns off the streets

National Firearms Amnesty to keep community safe.

Western Australians are being urged to hand over unlicensed firearms as part of a nationwide gun amnesty.

The National Firearms Amnesty begins on July 1, 2017 and aims to reduce the number of unregistered or illegal guns on the streets.

People will be able to surrender guns or gun parts at any WA police station without fear of being prosecuted.

Where suitable, WA Police will also allow those handing in the firearms to apply to have them registered.

The last amnesty held by WA Police resulted in more than 1,200 guns being surrendered.

The current amnesty will run for three months until September 30, 2017.

People are asked to plan ahead and call first, before visiting their local police station.

Telehealth keeps Wilhelmina on track

A monthly phone call keeps Southern Cross resident Wilhelmina Steel eating right and staying active.

Wilhelmina, 69, has lived with diabetes for the past 30 years and says sometimes she struggles to maintain the healthy lifestyle she needs to keep her condition under control.

But each month a member of the Silver Chain Health Navigator team calls her to chat about her health — and Wilhelmina says she can't bear telling her that she hasn't been exercising, and so she gets out walking.

"Knowing that Wendy from the Health Navigator service is going to call is always at the back of my mind and it inspires me – if she didn't ring I might not bother making an effort," she said.

Health Navigator Coordinators connect with clients using phone or videoconference, and once they have an understanding of the client's needs they link them with service providers either locally or elsewhere, using technology.

As a diabetic, it is important that Wilhelmina eats carefully, keeps her weight under control, and exercises regularly.

In the past Wilhelmina has also learned about managing her diabetes by speaking with Diabetes WA educators using videoconferencing equipment at the Southern Cross Hospital.

"Just learning about diabetes helps me get back on track," she said.

The Silver Chain Health Navigator and Diabetes WA telehealth services are partnerships with the WA Country Health Service, made possible through the Royalties for Regions' funded Southern Inland Health Initiative.

Wheatbelt and Great Southern people living with – or at risk of – chronic conditions of diabetes, heart failure, heart disease or long term lung conditions can access the Health Navigator service to manage their health. You can self-refer by calling 1300 650 803 or visiting the Silver Chain website, or speak to your GP.


