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# Message from the CEO



## 2017/18 Budget

Council adopted the 2017/18 Budget at the August Council meeting held last Thursday. The Shire was delayed in having the Budget adopted by additional red tape imposed by the new Department of Local Government. This required the Council to re-advertise the differential rates and hold two Special Council meetings, each lasting a couple of minutes, to satisfy the demands of bureaucrats in Perth. Quite frustrating when Council, back in June, agreed to keep rates unchanged to what was approved without fuss the previous year.

## Shire Rate Notices

Rate notices will be posted out this week. Council has agreed to a zero rate increase however the rates payable for UV Rural land owners may vary depending on any change in valuation imposed by the Valuer General.

The rates notice will include a Budget newsletter which provides useful information and highlights the key items included in the Shire's Budget.

## Council Elections

Nominations for Council are open in September. Please see notice in Crosswords which advises where further information can be obtained if you are thinking of running for Council. The Shire is happy to conduct an information session to suit any potential candidates. I can be contacted at the Shire office or by email to [ceo@yilgarn.wa.gov.au](mailto:ceo@yilgarn.wa.gov.au).

You must be enrolled to vote to be eligible to be a Councillor. Further information on the electoral roll is also included in Crosswords.

The elections are run by the WA Electoral Commission as it is a postal vote election. The WA Electoral Commission has again appointed Sue Bosenberg as the Returning Officer.

The process and requirements for nominating for Council must be strictly adhered to and be received by the Returning Officer by 4:00pm on Thursday 14 September. Late nominations, those not completed correctly, or nominations lodged without the correct fee, cannot be accepted.

Please contact Sue Bosenberg for further information on lodging a correct nomination.

## Street Bins

Hopefully you have noticed the Blue street bins appearing in the main street. The Shire looked into buying new street bins however as they cost approximately \$800 each we decided it was a better use of Shire money to paint the current ones. We have engaged the Men's Shed to paint the bins which is why they are being installed over a period of time.

## Flag Poles

You should have also noticed that the Shire flagpole has been moved to a more prominent location. The Shire has erected another two flagpoles and will soon fly the Australian, West Australian and Aboriginal flags every day that we are open.

## *Local Government Elections 2017*

Local government ordinary elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. Elections will be held on 21 October 2017.

Councillors are elected for terms of four years. Elections are held every two years for half of the council, and candidates are elected using the first-past-the-post voting system.

The nomination period to become a candidate in the 2017 Shire of Yilgarn elections opens on Thursday 7 September 2017 and closes on Thursday 14 September 2017 at 4.00pm.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION  
CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS  
Shire of Yilgarn  
ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017**

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 21 October 2017 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Yilgarn.

**Residents**

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

**Enrolment Forms**

Electoral enrolment forms are available from the Shire of Yilgarn, all post offices, all Australian Electoral Commission offices or the Western Australian Electoral Commission and must be completed and reach a Divisional Returning Officer in Western Australia by 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017.

**Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers**

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Yilgarn and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are **not** on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Yilgarn you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Yilgarn prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Yilgarn to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

**Joint Owners and Occupiers**

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

**Corporations**

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

**Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only**

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Yilgarn.

Every drum that is collected raises money for the Moorine Rock Primary School P&C, so if you have some containers lying around that qualify for DrumMUSTER collection, now is the time to bring them down and raise some money for the P&C.

Please remember that all drums are to be:-

- whole without caps or bungs or taps on/in the containers;
- to be clean inside and outside, including the thread around the opening and caps or bungs are not to be put back on – note that dye stains are accepted as they are not removed through the triple rinse process;
- containers are to be cleaned via the use of one of the following methods of rinsing –
  - triple rinsing,
  - pressure rinsing,
  - integrated rinsing;
- Containers are to be drained and dry of all residues.
- ***Note: Metal containers must be punctured 3-4 times through the bottom to assist with drainage of the container.***

No bookings required, just turn up between 12pm to 5pm.

# YILGARN HISTORY MUSEUM

## SOUTHERN CROSS INC.

### Bowls at Southern Cross

Plans for a bowling green first surfaced in 1907. A croquet club had just been formed and it was hoped to plough a further portion of the recreation reserve (town hall reserve) and plant grass for a bowling green.

The committee had great ideas of converting the area into a public garden. A large lawn suitable for croquet and tennis and bowls would be planted. These plans depended on Council established the bowling green and renting it back to the committee.

But Council had other priorities and the expense of scheme water killed off the idea before it even started.

Two world wars and a depression then got in the way of improving the town, and it was not until 1952 that plans for a bowling green were revived. The lower reserve (present footie oval) was under construction as a sporting ground, and it was intended that bowls and football and cricket and tennis would all be in close proximity. A committee was formed towards building the bowling green.

However the committee had its own ideas on where the bowling green should be located and asked for three adjoining blocks opposite the school. The site was sufficient space for 48 players on 16 rinks.

Work got underway with fifty yards of top soil from a patch near Wheatley tank being carted in for lawns, with grass planted during 1954. By the end of 1954 the bowling green was progressing nicely. Fencing and forming the rinks and planting a hedge were next.

To raise finance for the project, £10 debentures were issued. A loan from the Road Board was secured to build a club house which was made from second hand materials.

By mid-1956 the project had advanced to the stage of having lights installed for night play. The bowling club now looked impressive. Stonework and cement work gave it a handsome finish. Three shade houses made with steel frames and canvas sufficed until the clubhouse was ready.

The official opening was held over until January 1957. The committee had good reason to be proud, as Yilgarn Bowling Club had developed from a vacant block with a patch of weeds to a bowling green capable of staging competitions.

The club then went from success to success, enjoying a large membership with sufficient funds for maintenance and improvements. It staged carnivals with bowlers coming from all over the State. At the start of each season its members answered the call to get the greens back in order and ready for bowling.

By mid-1960's, bowling continued through the winter months, weather permitting. Card evenings were held on Thursdays.

However there was shortcomings with sport fragmented all over the town, and the idea of grouping all sporting activities together was reactivated in 1969. Delegates from the seven sporting bodies met to discuss building a Sportsman's Club at Southern Cross.

The odd man out was the bowling club which was not interested. The idea of a Sportsman's Club then simmered for the next 43 years.

As the years rolled along the Bowling Club was not immune to problems. During 1971 the club had to conduct their fours carnival at Merredin due to the greens at the Cross not being up to standard.

1973 was also a problem year. The railways had scaled back and families were leaving the district. The bowling club was in danger of folding due short of numbers.

Club members were unanimous that the club be kept open, and planned night bowling to attract new members. Dress would be optional except for official functions.

To raise funds the old sports ground (greater sports ground near the hospital) was cropped with wheat, proceeds going to Homes for the Aged and the Bowling Club.

By 1976 the club had weathered the storm. It had never looked better with the green in wonderful condition. And year after year the faithful turned out for their game of bowls. Club champion was a sought after position.

For some 55 years the bowling club opposite the school was a stand-out feature and one of the few green spots in town. But it was an aging amenity. The time had come to relocate to a more favourable position near the tennis courts, as was intended way back in 1952.

A shared club house or Sportsman's Club with the bowling green alongside the tennis courts was finally a reality with the official opening held in September 2012, thanks to our Shire Council which doggedly pursued what was best for the town.

Full marks to the stalwarts who kept the old bowling club going year after year, and full marks to the original band who gave so much sweat and tears and money to get the club up and running. May the new bowling green be as successful?
