Nominations Open on Thursday, 7 September 2017 **Nominations Close** at 4:00pm Thursday, 14 September 2017 Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer:

• at any time during the above period by arrangement; or

• between 2:00pm and 4:00pm Thursday, 14 September 2017 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Yilgarn, 23 Antares Street, SOUTHERN CROSS.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. (This form is available from the Returning Officer, the Western Australian Electoral Commission or the Shire of Yilgarn);
- a single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of information about the candidate:
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order); and
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional).

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed at elections.wa.gov.au

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered, posted or faxed to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

E-WASTE COLLECTION

The Shire will hold an E-Waste Collection on Saturday 21st October 2017 at the Old Main Roads Depot, Beaton Road from 9am-11am.

Residents are asked to bring their unwanted and acceptable electrical equipment for recycling – there will be **NO** curbside collection.

E-Waste - Did You Know ??

- ✓ Electronic waste or "E-waste" may be defined as anything that operates from a power source; either mains power, solar or a battery, and can include computer equipment, entertainment devices, mobile phones, television sets and kitchen appliances.
- ✓ Approximately 98% of all electronic products are recyclable.
- ✓ Small batteries from hand-held devices can also be recycled.
- ✓ To be recycled, e-waste is first disassembled and broken into the base materials such as: Steel, Plastic, Brass, Aluminum, Stainless Steel, Glass, Lead, Wood, Copper Gold, Silver, Palladium and other precious metals.
- This process also separates out hazardous materials such as Lead, Cadmium, Barium, Beryllium, Arsenic, Ink fluid, Toner dust and Mercury, and prevents them from entering land-fills and waterways.

Recycling does cost money, which may deter people from choosing this option, however landfilling electronic products can cause damage to the environment. When E-waste is dumped in landfill the hazardous materials mentioned above are leached out, these can then contaminate the soil and ground water.







February 1933 will be remembered as the time when arsonists struck at Southern Cross. It was an anxious week as skulking arsonists set fire to building after building in the dead of night.

The first building to go up in flames was the Mechanics Institute Hall, which was situated at the south end of the main street (lot 33). The wooden building and its adjoining library had been built in the early 1890's and served as the town hall. This is how the local newspaper saw the week that Southern Cross burnt:

....Early Sunday morning a fire resulted in the complete destruction of the Mechanics Hall and the adjoining building known as the Lesser Hall. Constructed of wood and iron over 40 years ago the building was highly inflammable once the fire got hold. The alarm was given by Mr Madin the Assistant Station Master who saw signs of fire as he was returning to his home. He motored to the Fire Station and gave the alarm and called out with the aid of the motor horn. The Fire Brigade turned out smartly in answer to the ringing of the bell on the station tower. A line of hose was taken to attack the fire on Antares Street side, while a second hose was used on the north of the property to prevent fire spreading to Mr Williams' store about 30 feet away. It was soon apparent that no water supply would suppress the fire and efforts were concentrated in preventing the fire from spreading, by hosing the roof and walls of Williams' store. A favourable feature was the absence of wind. The building was historical in relation to Southern Cross. The Miners Union in cooperation with townspeople built the hall and attached a library. For many years it was the recognised place of resort for literature, while the hall was used for dances and entertainment. The hall committee expended £900 on the first building, with the bulk being contributed by the public plus a small government grant; the site being given by the Under the control of the Yilgarn Road Board the main hall was recently enlarged and renovated and a biograph box erected and a new floor put down, which provided much needed space for the increasing population of the district and town. The origin of the fire is unknown but possibly a dropped cigarette from a careless smoker. There was a great crowd of residents watching the demolition of the building and the efforts of the local firemen. Much satisfaction was expressed by the way the firemen maintained their splendid efforts. But for the fine efforts of the Brigade in preventing the fire spreading from the Mechanics Hall the whole of Antares Street could have shared a similar fate to the two halls. Too much praise cannot be given for these young men who volunteer to protect the town. The efforts of these fighters are not generally appreciated until the occasion arises for a call on their services. To stand and work a hose in close proximity to the fire such as we witnessed calls for the highest courage and endurance."

The next building to go up in flames was the powerhouse which housed the generators for the town's electricity supply. This building stood behind the present shire offices:

....A second outbreak of fire occurred at 2am on Monday in the Yilgarn Road Board powerhouse, resulting in extensive damage to plant and buildings. The fire originated in the portion of the building where the auxiliary crude oil engine is installed; this engine taking up the running after the main engine is stopped at midnight. It is not known who gave the alarm but when the Fire Brigade was summonsed there was a good pressure of

water available. Clouds of black smoke obscured vision for the firemen but eventually the fire was mastered. Although electric power for next day was cut off, the efforts of the engineers and mechanics had reconditioning of the main engine advanced enough by the afternoon for a trial run, and by nightfall the usual service was available. In both fires the nozzle holder fireman endured much heat through the fierceness of the blaze. Those early on the scene were convinced that nothing could be done for the powerhouse and the position hopeless, but the splendid manner which the Brigade attacked the blaze under their leader calls for commendation of the highest order. Mr Len Carlson the leader of the fire brigade was eventually overcome by the black oily smoke and is now confined to bed under medical attention."

A large stack of bagged wheat in the railway yard awaiting railing was the next target. This was in the days before wheat bins.

....During Thursday night the Fire Brigade was called out to a fire in a wheat stack in the railway yards, where nominal damage was done."

Universal stores which stood where the ANZ Bank now stands was the next target:

....At the Universal Stores in Antares Street a fire originated in an iron building at the rear of the main premises. A good pressure of water suppressed the outbreak."

Next was the old wooden railway station. A large empty space opposite the Railway Hotel marks the site of the old station:

....About 4am on Friday morning a fire was reported in the ladies waiting room at the railway station. It was quickly overcome and the spread of fire stopped."

The old Road Board building situated where the present Shire Office stands had a lucky escape:

....There was sensation in Antares Street on Saturday night about 10.30 pm when a reflection of fire was observed at the Yilgarn Road Board office. Bystanders on the footpath opposite the Club Hotel which included Sergeant McGowan and Constable Cheshire rushed across to investigate. The fire was under the building on the west side, and with great promptitude Constable Cheshire stooped down and pulled out the burning material, found to be sacking saturated in oil. A shout from the party stopped the bell being rung, this prompt action probably averting a panic in Goodin's Hall and Liddle's Hall where pictures were being shown. A fire extinguisher brought from Liddle's Hall dealt with the blazing sacking."

Thankfully the arsonist's run had come to an end:

....Acting on information received the police arrested two young men. Clarence William Spencer a railway porter and George Edward Martain a wheat lumper were charged with attempting to set fire to the Yilgarn Road Board office on February 11. Martian's brother is a volunteer fire fighter."

During their trial the lads told the Magistrate they had decided to liven the place up. The Magistrate had no hesitation in jailing the pair to put a stop to their shenanigans. Southern Cross could breathe easy once more.




