



New glass display cabinets, mannequins, and signage were installed as well as an insulated storage building, to store items when not on display. The new display units allowed old wooden cabinets to be moved to a different part of the museum and the Mining room has been totally redone, creating a fantastic new, open, display. To move everything out and setup the new display took five volunteers over two weeks to complete.



Aborigines (part one)

The indigenous population played their part in opening up the Yilgarn district. They accompanied the early gold expeditions as guides and water locaters. Indeed the prospectors owe a debt to the aborigines for sharing their precious water, and in some cases finding the gold itself. Without their guides many prospecting parties would have been hopelessly bushed.

The early newspapers paint a picture of helpful aborigines. In 1887 aboriginal Phillip guided Harry Anstey and party to the first gold strike made in the Yilgarn district at Eenuin, although Anstey claimed Phillip did not find the money stone, as at the time 'he was lying under a tree.' When two of the party became blinded with sandy blight while prospecting, it was Phillip who led their horses safely back to camp where the pair were able to recuperate.

A few months later Bernard Colreavy discovered Golden Valley. In his report he gave his aboriginal tracker some of the credit for his success.

Tom Riseley's tracker was known as Wheelbarrow. During a prospecting expedition Wheelbarrow led the party to a soak near Southern Cross 'that was as dry as we were.' As the party had already been two days without water, they returned to Golden Valley that night using the Southern Cross constellation as their guide; hence the naming of the town shortly afterwards. Wheelbarrow became a police tracker. He made history by accompanying Corporal McCarthy to Coolgardie a few years later to establish a police presence. Incidentally the police horses were stolen on arrival at Coolgardie, and it was Wheelbarrow who tracked them down for the first arrest to be made.

William Parker was so grateful for the help given by his guide named Governor Broom, that he built an iron 'white fella' fence around the grave of Broom's brother. Parker had previously shown his faithful guide a specimen of gold. Broom said he could show him a mountain of this stone at the place where he was born, and so Parkers Range goldfield was born.

A touching story involves Gillies McPherson when he became demented with thirst during a prospecting trip. He handed his revolver to his native guide named Toby, and begged Toby to shoot him. Instead Toby tied McPherson to his horse and got him back into Southern Cross. A few years later McPherson went to the Yukon gold strike in Canada, where he had the misfortune to lose his life in a snow storm.

When it came to tracking people lost in the bush, the aboriginal can rightly claim to hold the advantage over white men. Their uncanny ability to read the terrain was instrumental in many lives being saved. The police would call upon natives to assist them in searching for lost souls. The tracker would run following the signs until he dropped, while the policeman rode behind on his horse.

Not always did the search have a happy ending. Back in 1887 two prospectors named Shea and Beadles became lost and died of thirst while attempting to walk twelve miles from Eenuin to Golden Valley. They were buried where they were found. Shea had gone mad with thirst and torn up his clothes a piece at a time and scratched at the ground around him. Beadles had struggled back to within a mile of water and was found on the broad of his back with his arms folded and his hat and boots under his head. Aboriginals Jack Bennal and Paddy tracked the lost men for three days, during which time they themselves suffering much from the want of water. As a reward for the natives, the Governor approved £5 to be placed at the disposal of District Constable Adams to purchase 'things that would delight them.'

In 1898 a woman named Constance Janeczek became lost near Strawberry Rock. For several days she was tracked through bush and scrub, 'going round and round.' The untiring efforts of native trackers led to her being saved.

A railway worker named Michael O'Reilly met his death after becoming lost in the bush between Kellandie and Yellowdine. He had imbibed rather freely and left Yellowdine to walk to Kellandie armed with two bottles of whisky. After wandering aimlessly for days he was found by Tracker Joe. Although still alive, he succumbed shortly afterwards.

In May 1900 a railway worker name named Charles Jefford became lost in the bush near Warri. He was found by a search party the following evening after wandering 25 miles. Explained he had merely gone for stroll in the bush – he was not lost, just didn't know where he was.

Two children aged 5 years and 2 years wandered from their home in Southern Cross. Search parties were organised and set out in different directions. The kiddie's tracks were picked up on a road going south, and when found by the trackers the youngest child was blue with exhaustion after travelling 8 miles.

One of the larger searches was for young Osborne Goodin who became lost near Moorine Rocks. The family had gone on a camping trip and the child wandered off. It was 12 hours before the police at Southern Cross were notified, and an elderly native name George was secured. George found the boy's tracks about 2 miles from the camping site where he had crossed a track. Then the art of tracking was put to the test in a belt of hard country covered with thick scrub. It took a whole day to track 9 miles with the native going down on hands and knees like a bloodhound on the boy's scent. Occasionally the native would point out to the white men a recently disturbed stone or broken twig of tuft of grass bent down. However George was old and feeble and had to give in because his eyesight was failing. Meanwhile Sergeant Pilmar seconded another native named Windiarra who arrived next morning. 'Wendy' soon got on the track, and together the two men hastened along, every now and then stopping to listen intently. The boy's track now zig zagged so badly they knew the little one was on his last legs. When they found the little boy lying on the ground his tongue was so swollen he could barely speak 'where's my dad.' The child had been lost for 41 hours with neither food nor water during this time. Constable O'Brien said it was worth a £1,000 to be in the position of restoring the youngster to his mother. The Goodin family became long-time residents of Southern Cross. Wendy was appointed Native Assistant at Southern Cross Police Station.

The Moorine Rock area figured in another rescue when Mrs Rankin from the Parkers Road pub became lost. She had gone into the bush to find a strayed horse and failed to return. Fortunately she was accompanied by her pet goat and pet lamb which left a clear trail. The railway station master tracked her for 9 miles until it became too dark; he then slept on the track. By this stage Constable Cleary and native tracker Cribb had arrived from Southern Cross. Cribb got onto the lamb's track and ran along it for 12 miles through dense scrub and over hard ironstone country. At about midday they came upon the poor old woman who was greatly distressed - she had thrown away her hat and torn up most of her dress. Mrs Rankin rapidly recovered when given a drink of water but refused to leave her pets in the scrub. The newspaper claimed it was probably the first time that a lamb had saved the life of a woman in the wilds of WA.

A little bit of trivia – Constable Cassidy of Southern Cross was involved in many rescues. When he was transferred he was presented with a watch by the grateful people of Southern Cross for his services and rescues of lost souls. The police commissioner made him give it back, as policemen were not allowed to accept gifts!

With regard to Yilgarn's aborigines, Yilgarn was home to the Kalamaia aborigine group for thousands of years. Their territory stretched from Burracoppin to Boorabbin, and Mount Holland to Lake Barlee, an area of approximately 88,000 square kilometres. North/east is Wongi, north/west Yamagies, Nyungar in the south/west, and Kalks from the Norseman area.

Please note: This information is a guide and is subject to change. You require an appointment to be seen. Child Health appointments can be made by calling Southern Cross Child Health Clinic on 9049 1321. Appointments for all other services can be made by phoning Primary Health on 9041 0444.

What does the Child Development Team Do?

We work in a family centred model of care, meaning we work closely with parents and carers to promote the health and support the development of all children aged 0-18 years across the Eastern Wheatbelt.

Who is our Child Development Team?

Our Child Development Team is a multidisciplinary team of health care professionals. We also have visits from a Paediatrician and Clinical Psychologist to provide specialist input for children requiring more support.

Occupational Therapist:

Assists with fine motor skills, self-care skills and sensory processing

Health Promotion:

Assists with child development strategies and programs in the community

Aboriginal Health:

Supports families to access child development services

Social Worker:

Supports families with counselling and advocacy

Child Health Nurse: Developmental

screening, immunisation, family care and school health

Dietitian:

Assists with nutrition and feeding problems

Speech Pathologist:

Assists with communication and feeding

Physiotherapist:

Assists with gross motor skills, coordination and balance

What is the Referral Process?

You can self-refer your child or receive a referral from your GP, Child Health Nurse or Teacher via your School Health Nurse. You require a referral from your GP for our visiting Paediatrician.

Each week our Child Development Team meets to look at new referrals. We look at the needs of each child referred and prioritise them to ensure they are seen accordingly. This process ensures clients receive equal access to our health services based on the severity and complexity of their health care needs.

What Happens after the Referral is Received?

You will be contacted when the referral is received and appointments will be made with the best suited professional to assist with your child's needs at that time.

We aim to be as accommodating as possible by offering services through home visits, outreach clinics and school visits. A family may be asked to travel to a nearby town to receive a quality service.

What Happens in an Appointment?

During your Child's appointment we will explore and set realistic developmental goals based on your family's priorities. We will assist with therapy strategies which can be included in everyday activities and routines to support your child to achieve these goals.

Aboriginal Health Team

We offer support for our families and carers to access child development services. We offer a flexible and culturally appropriate service with a fortnightly drop in clinic where families and carers can attend to see our Child Health Nurse. We can also assist with transport to appointments given appropriate notice.

Tip for Parents and Carers to look after teeth:

After 6 months encourage your child to use a 'Sippy' cup.

I work around clinical consultations with families and children and can help with a range of areas including:

allergies and intolerance, weight management, healthy eating, constipation or diarrhoea and fussy eating.

Tip for Parents and Carers of fussy eaters:

Try a broad variety of foods often, as children need to be offered a food at least 10 times before they will accept it.

Occupational Therapist

Dietetics

We support children with their occupations, such as school work, playing, learning and self-care skills. We often look at fine motor (hand) skills, sensory processing and attention.

Fine Motor Tips for Parents and Carers:

Provide lots of opportunities for your child to use their hands. This might include: scribbling, threading beads, using scissors, doing jigsaws and cooking.

Social Work

My focus as a social worker is to work with individuals and families to improve physical, emotional and social well-being. Areas I can assist with include: mental and physical health, family concerns, grief, loss or trauma and advocacy for housing, Centrelink or financials.

Tip for all Parents and Carers:

Seek help as soon as you can before a problem becomes a crisis.

Child Health Nurse

We work in partnership with parents and careers of children to provide family health care, immunisations and developmental health assessments. Our nurses work both in the community and schools to help families make informed decisions.

Tip for Parents and Carers:

If you are seeking any advice on child development, feeding, healthy weight and lifestyle, behaviour, stress or anxiety please contact your Child Health Clinic!

Health Promotion

We offer a range of education sessions at playgroups, community events and schools. Early intervention and prevention is a priority for our team, if you would like to organise a visit from our team please contact us!

Screen time Tips for Parents and Carers:

It is recommended that children under 2 years do not have any screen time and that children 2-5 years old do not have more than 1 hour of screen time a day.

Physiotherapist

We assess the gross motor skills in Children. This involves looking at strength, flexibility, coordination and balance. Some children may have difficulty with learning new skills including running, jumping, walking and tripping over or poor posture.

Gross Motor Tips for Parents and Carers:

Incorporate skills in active play! From balancing on a wall, playing catch with a coloured ball or encouraging them to climb, crawl or hop.

Speech Pathologist

We can help with children who may have difficulty in communicating or feeding because of a range of reasons including delayed development or disability. Some different areas we can assist with include making sounds to form words correctly, stuttering, fluency of speech and feeding techniques.

Reading Tip for all Parents and Carers:

Read aloud with your child, point to words as you say them and encourage them to talk about the pictures.



Yilgarn timeline (continued)

1952 The school bus service has been extended from Ghooli to Yellowdine. About 27 children are bussed daily from Ghooli and Yellowdine, since their schools closed.

About forty trees will be removed from the recreation reserve to make way for extensions etc.

Charlie Preston has got the town hall clock to function properly. It was a gift from Claude DeBernales in 1936 but has never kept good time. For the past thirteen years it has remained motionless.

A committee has been formed to establish a bowling green opposite the school.

1953 The free milk scheme will shortly come into operation at SX State School. Each child will receive about a third of a pint each day.

Bullen Bros circus showed here on Monday night. Children flocked to the site to see animals unloaded and the tent set up.

In an emergency our water supplies could be harvested from the many rock catchments in this district. A survey should be made to find those rocks suitable for the purpose.

Jack Coyle who joined up from SX was recently killed in the Korean War.

The un-bituminised sections in the main street are to be sealed shortly.
