
ANZAC DAY Temporary Road Closure – Southern Cross





Pioneers of Pilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Kennedy, John and Alice: John came to Southern Cross during the mid-1890's, his first venture being the lime leases on the edge of town, supplying the mines with lime to neutralise cyanide solution. In 1900 he married Alice Henry who ran a private hospital, the couple then taking on the Railway Hotel. The Kennedy's also took up 160 acres of farming land and grew wheat. They were a civic minded couple and when Council refused to plant trees on Railway Reserve, they did so at their own expense. After the death of her husband in 1913, Alice took over the Southern Cross hotel. When it was delicenced in 1923, she bought the Club Hotel. Alice was an astute business woman. As well as running pubs she grub staked prospectors for a share in any gold She also owned several mines, the found. Warden commenting there was nothing wrong with a woman being a leaseholder. Alice died in 1929 and is buried alongside her husband in Southern Cross cemetery.

Aviators

Articles on famous flyers, Sir Charles Kingsford Smith and Amy Johnson in the West newspaper recently, brings to mind their association with our little town of Southern Cross.

Smithy became an Australian legend in aviation. He named his aeroplane 'Southern Cross' but the reason why is unclear. Delving into the Smith family history reveals that Smithy's father moved to Vancouver in Canada just prior to Smithy becoming a household name.

In Vancouver his father helped establish and became founding secretary of a Masonic Lodge which was named Southern Cross Lodge No 54, the very same name and number as our own Southern Cross Masonic lodge. The two lodge's corresponded over the years and became 'sister lodges.'

On one of Smithy's flying trips to Canada to see his father, he returned to Australia with a letter addressed to our lodge. Was this the first airmail letter? And did this family involvement lead to Smithy's famous plane being named the 'Southern Cross'? A fellow historian who was writing a book about Smithy a few years ago, asked me did I know why the plane was named 'Southern Cross.' I told him the same story I am telling you.

Amy Johnson flew into the history books by being the first female to fly solo from England to Australia, in April 1930. An aeroplane no bigger than a car, with only a huge and noisy engine for company, day after day. She flew over our township of Southern Cross, following the railway line for bearings. This was how pilots navigated in the days before instruments.

The local newspaper had this to say:

"Miss Amy Johnson, who flew solo from England to Australia, flew over Southern Cross about 8.55 am. She was flying low and in bright sunshine. Scores of people rushed into the street and waved and cheered. The plane turned gracefully, passed over the post office, and then resumed its course west."

We would like to think that Amy acknowledged the townspeople waving in the street by her impulse to deviate slightly from the railway line. It was a nice gesture.

WATCH YOUR PORTION SIZE

To be a healthy weight, you need to watch the amount of food that you eat to make sure you aren't eating too much.

We may think bigger serves are better value for money, but they're actually costing our health a great deal more!

Bigger portions mean we consume more energy (kJ). This is an even bigger problem when we eat highly processed snack food, take away foods and sugary drinks.



Tips to eat healthy portion sizes: • Use a smaller plate.

- Avoid going back for seconds and freeze leftovers straight away.
- Still hungry? Have a glass of water. If you're still hungry, try a healthy snack such as a piece of fruit.



- Eat at the table, not in front of the TV.
- Aim to fill half your plate with veg, one quarter with meat and alternatives (e.g. chicken, fish, legumes or tofu) and the last quarter with cereals and grains (e.g. rice, pasta, bread).

Packaged food, take-away food and restaurant meals have been getting bigger and bigger, and are now served in very large portions.



When eating out, try ordering an entree size or share a main meal with a friend.

If your child is due for a developmental check, immunisation or you have any other queries please contact us or your local clinic.

Meningococcal vaccine for 1-4 year olds

A FREE vaccination to protect against meningococcal strains ACWY is being offered to all children aged 12 months to less than five years.



Meningococcal disease is an uncommon, but sometimes life-threatening illness. At any one time, about 10 per cent of healthy people carry meningococcal bacteria harmlessly in their nose or throat and do not become ill. To reduce the incidence of meningococcal disease among this vulnerable age group, a free vaccine will be available throughout 2018.

Contact your local GP or Child Health Clinic to schedule an appointment for your child/children to receive the vaccine.


