### RURAL NUMBERING SYSTEM INTRODUCTION

Council intends allocating funds in the 2019/2020 Budget to implement the Rural Numbering System for rural property owners in the Shire. This will enable the project to be completed in the first half of 2020.

The Rural Numbering System has been introduced in many Shires throughout the Wheatbelt and South West areas of the State and has been hailed as an important identifier of properties for first responders in emergency situations.

There will be some inconvenience to rural property owners once new property numbers have been allocated and the system is in place, mainly relating to change of address notifications to Telstra, Synergy and Water Corporation as these providers will not change addresses unless requested to do so by the account holder. Non-government organisations that the landholder privately deals with will also need to be advised of address changes when the Rural Numbering System is introduced.

Rural residents will be kept informed of the progress of this project and Council staff will work closely with residents to ensure a smooth transition takes place. Should rural residents wish to obtain further information regarding this project, please contact the undersigned on 90 491 001.

Firstly, the Yilgarn Local Action Group would like to wish all its Farmers well for this years Harvest.

Secondly, there have been a few changes to the Skeleton weed program for the 18/19 season as directed by the Department of Primary Industry & Regional Development:

- New Finds, Code 1 & Code 3 paddocks are eligible for search assistance
- All **code one** paddocks need to be searched by the **31st of December 2018**. All **other codes** need to be searched by the **31st of January 2019**.
- All property and **paddock records** to be sent in by the **15th February 2019**.
- Whilst invoices need to be sent in by March 15th, please try & get all paperwork into Bec **before Feb 15th 2019**, before she goes on maternity leave.

Due to the rains in November we are expecting an increase in Skeleton weed plant numbers.  
Please be extra vigilant when searching **code 2 & 3** paddocks this year.

### **Don't duck out – make portable pools safe**

Many of us have fond memories of splashing around in a portable pool as a child and, as the weather warms up, we've launched a campaign to remind parents and carers to make these pools safe.

Portable pools – ranging from small blow-up or plastic paddling or kiddie pools to bigger wading pools, inflatable spas or high-sided flexible plastic pools on a frame – can be popular in summer as a cheap alternative to below-ground pools but they are just as dangerous.

On average one child dies from a portable pool-related drowning every year in Australia, while others need hospital treatment, may be left with severe brain injuries and limited life expectancy. For example a toddler who drowned in a portable pool in Noranda in 2015 sadly passed away two years later.

Drowning statistics have prompted Australian Consumer Law and product safety regulators to join forces with the Royal Life Saving Society to spread water safety messages.

We partnered with Royal Life Saving in 2014/15 to run a campaign called 'Make It Safe' and now we've added the reminder of 'Don't Duck Out' of the responsibilities you take on when you buy a portable pool which may include putting up a safety barrier.

Adults following the Don't Duck Out, Make It SAFE tips, such as keeping constant watch of kids around portable pools, can reduce the risk and potentially save lives. The SAFE tips are to:

- ✓ **Supervise** - actively watch children within arm's reach. Don't leave older children in charge.
- ✓ **Act** - learn emergency first aid including CPR. It's important to start compressions and breaths as soon as possible when a child is pulled from the water and to call triple zero (000) for help. If there are two people, one should make the phone call while the other does CPR.
- ✓ **Fence** - in WA, and most of Australia, pools with more than 30cm of water in, are legally required to have a compliant safety barrier and could be fined or prosecuted if you don't. Check with your local Council.
- ✓ **Empty** and store safely - after keeping watch all day, pour out water and put the pool away where children can't reach. Never leave it where it can refill with rain or sprinkler water.

As part of the campaign, we've been working with major retailers who will also be helping to spread the Don't Duck Out, Make It SAFE message at the point of sale. Under the Australian Consumer Law, portable pools and their packaging are required to have labels drawing the buyer's attention to drowning risk, the need for active supervision, proper storage and local fencing laws.

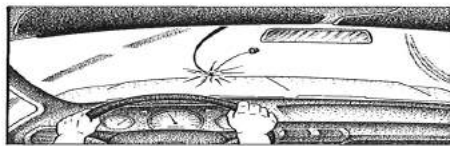
## DRIVER REVIVER – CHRISTMAS 2018

# Pioneers of Yilgarn

## Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years  
1887 and 1914

**Murphy family:** Felix and Anne and nine children moved in from Golden Valley to Southern Cross when the town was in its infancy. Felix had been employed at the Golden Valley pub.

While he returned to collect another load, his wife and daughter selected a site to build a store which later became lot 9 when the town was surveyed.

Felix was surprised to see his shop nearly completed by willing helpers when he returned, such being the power of females in a predominantly male town.

A much needed boarding house was built at the rear to provide a home from home for miners. While Felix and his son operated a carrying business, his wife and daughters ran the shop and boarding house.

The daughters found husbands with one daughter giving birth to the first child born at Southern Cross.

Felix was an inaugural councillor when the Municipality was formed. He was also appointed leader of the first convoy of wagons off to Coolgardie when it was discovered in 1892, followed by dozens of walkers who paid to have their gear carted on the wagons.

His son drove the first coach with two men in front cutting the track as they went. Mrs Murphy and daughter followed with a dray loaded with goods, having the honour of being the first white females into Coolgardie, where they set up a shop.

The family did not lose their ties with Southern Cross for some years, afterwards retiring to Leederville.
