GREAT EASTERN HIGHWAY UPGRADES

Main Roads WA has advised that it will be commencing works to widen narrow sections of the Great Eastern Highway between Walgoolan and Southern Cross to a consistent 9 metre wide road with audible edge lines.

Works will commence on the week of 29 January 2019 and are expected to be completed at the end of March 2019. Main Roads WA has indicated that there will be several works locations at the one time. Work will start in Southern Cross and move in a westerly direction. Some works will have lane closures with speed restrictions, other sections will be rolling with attenuators (e.g., like line marking works).

Main Roads WA will be erecting message boards to advise motorists of the impending works.

Assessment Criteria:

Preference will be given to landholders who haven't received many/any Shire projects in the past.

- Species must be planted to tackle poor production areas (issues such as salinity, wind erosion, or other 'land degradation matters').
- Saltbush Seedlings will be delivered on-farm during late June/early July 2019. Applicants **must** be able to accept, care for (water every day) and plant seedlings at any time within this period.
- Stock **must** be kept off saltbush seedlings for the first 12 months.

Planting information:

Seedlings should be planted in blocks or belts at 1000 stems/ha depending on soil capacity and layout. There should be barley grass present as indicator that the species will survive on intended site.

Seedling Information:

The Shire of Yilgarn is proposing that a subsidy of 20 cents per seedling be paid by the receiving landholder to help offset the costs involved (each Oldman seedling costs 50 cents). Oldman Saltbush is native to the semi-arid areas of Australia and is well adapted to conditions.

There have been a few changes to the Skeleton weed program for the 18/19 season as directed by the Department of Primary Industry & Regional Development:

- New Finds, Code 1 & Code 3 paddocks are eligible for search assistance
- All **code one** paddocks need to be searched by the **31st of December 2018**. All **other codes** need to be searched by the **31st of January 2019**.
- All property and **paddock records** to be sent in by the **15th February 2019**.
- Whilst invoices need to be sent in by March 15th, please try & get all paperwork into Bec **before Feb 15th 2019**, before she goes on maternity leave.

Due to the rains in November we are expecting an increase in Skeleton weed plant numbers.

Please be extra vigilant when searching **code 2 & 3** paddocks this year.

The following poems in this paid ad, from my 16 bicycle rides Perth to Kalgoorlie and having lived in Southern Cross 1978/79 when Ray Mangini was Shire Clerk, Ken Beaton Shire President and Horace Della Bosca Deputy Shire President. Tony Bozich

The name 'Hines Hill' seems a contradiction, looking at the hamlet's terrain,
it's like an abuse of diction for it's located on a plain.

On the west there's swamp and water, bare looking surrounds with stunted tree trunks,
like it was levelled by a mortar and good now only for mortifying monks.

On the eastern side, if I clear recall, there are more traditional wheat lands,
and an old run down corrugated iron hall peopled once by dances, music and bands.
Hines Hill once fulfilled a higher aim for it yet retains an aura of faded fame.

Twenty two kilometres from the Cross Moorine Rock seems a name exotic,
name researchers might be at a loss and declare the founders were quixotic.
For this tiny place is on the flat and no special boulder's to be seen,

Make sure your donations go to legitimate charities

Western Australians are well known for their generosity but donors need to ensure that they are dealing with a licensed organisation to ensure their money reaches the intended recipients.

Always ask for identification from door-to-door charity collectors and, if you do donate to them, get a receipt. Times for door-to-door collections for a charitable purpose are between 9am and 6pm Monday to Saturday. Generally no collections are allowed on Sundays and Public Holidays.

Any organisation or club collecting money or goods from the public for charitable purposes needs to be licensed under the *Charitable Collections Act, which is administered by Consumer Protection*.

Well-meaning community members trying to raise money for others can end up inadvertently doing the wrong thing because they are unaware of the need to get a licence or to ask an established charity to work under their licence and supervision.

There is no fee required to obtain a licence and applications are reviewed by the Charitable Collections Advisory Committee. This committee consists of five independent members appointed by the Governor of Western Australia, it meets monthly to consider new applications or make recommendations to the Minister about charity licensing matters.

As a condition of holding a licence, the charity has to lodge financial statements to show money is being spent as it should be, and that only reasonable operating costs are deducted. Making charities accountable in this way also helps to protect them from criticism about funds not being used appropriately.

However, it's important to be aware that organisations collecting and receiving money from the public for non-charitable purposes do not need a licence. This includes social and sporting clubs, schools or kindergartens, which raise funds for their own use.

Tip for donors:

- Haven't heard of a charity before? Check WA's licensed charities register at www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au before donating.
- Ask face-to-face collectors for proof of identity and permission to collect, such as a street collection permit or authorisation letter from a licensed charity.
- Report unlicensed charity collections to Consumer Protection or complain to the relevant crowd funding website if you think a campaign is a scam.

Tips for collectors:

- To run a one-off, short-term fundraiser, approach an existing licensed charity, such as a Rotary Club, to ask to collect under their authority.
- For crowd funding campaigns we recommend Everyday Hero, which connects the fundraising campaign to established charities.
- Charitable organisations wishing to authorise fundraising activities under their charity licence should download the guidance pack from our website.

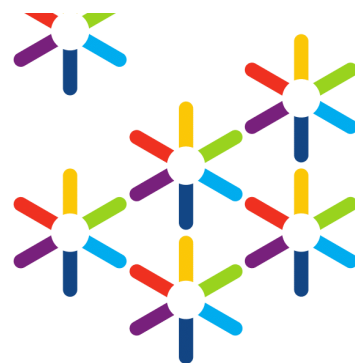

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Nunn, James: Came to Southern Cross in 1898. He worked on the mines and then the railway for some years, while his wife kept a few cows on the town common and sold the milk.

Eventually James's wife was making more money than him, so he joined her to establish a dairy, taking up farming land 4 miles east of town. Nunn went on to become one of the leading farmers in Yilgarn.

He was also civic minded and for many years a member of Yilgarn Road Board, being a long-serving Chairman.

When the district was opened to farming in the mid-1920's, Nunn was a beacon for new land settlers of what could be achieved.

He died in 1942 and is buried in our local cemetery. Descendants of Nunn still reside in Southern Cross.
