Permits are to be sought from your local Fire Control Officer, prior to any restricted burning activities. Permits to burn stubble from the previous seasons crop will not be issued until 1st March 2019. Fire breaks must be in place before permission to burn will be granted.

Oats, William: Captain Oats came to Southern Cross in December 1889 to manage Frasers South Mine. For a short period he also managed Frasers Mine in addition to Frasers South.

Oats was a born leader who served as mayor of Southern Cross for some years. He influenced the future of the town when it was in its infancy.

He then won the inaugural parliamentary seat of Yilgarn when it was created, where he contributed even more to the district.

Over time he served in both the lower and upper houses, elected each time he nominated until retirement fifteen years later.

Because of his influence as mayor and parliamentarian, some saw him as the ‘father’ of Southern Cross.

Thankfully, the weather hasn't stopped visitors (though numbers are low), from dropping in, or kept our Volunteers away. 2018 was busy and very successful—both with the number of visitors, and the new displays—and 2019 is set to be as successful.

Thanks to our very supportive Shire Councillors, we've started the New Year with a very much appreciated "Rolls Royce" kitchen. The "very" old cabinets were taken out and new cabinets installed after the Christmas break. Apart from the very pleasing aesthetic appearance, this has cleared the wall shelves for the storage of archival boxes, thus leaving the new Storage Shed free for "objects". How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



Talk

For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



Listen

Just being there for someone and offering a listening ear can make a difference.

1. Show them that you care and are here to listen to them.
2. Have patience, let others talk and don't judge.
3. Be reflective by repeating what they have said.
4. Keep calm and accept that they may disagree with you.



Provide support

If the person you're concerned about is in a life threatening situation, or is at risk of harm to themselves or others, call 000.

Getting help early can make a difference. A good place to start is:

- Talk to your GP or someone you trust.
- Call a support line.
- Contact a support service.
- Try the Think Mental Health check-up tool.

They may also need your support while they look for professional help.



Do an activity together

Activities create conversation. Find an opportunity during everyday life activities to start the conversation and ask them how they are really feeling. Try doing activities together such as:

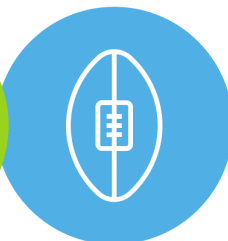

Are you interested in the biosecurity of Western Australia's agricultural industries?

Western Australian producers and other stakeholders in the dairy, beef, grain/seed, hay, sheep and/or goat industries and respective supply chains are invited to apply for positions on Industry Funding Scheme Management Committees.

[Industry Funding Schemes](#) enable agricultural industries to raise funds to address priority pests and diseases at a whole-of-industry level.

The schemes are industry-driven and overseen by a Management Committee made up of producers and other stakeholders with appropriate industry knowledge and expertise.

Members of the committees are appointed by the Minister for Agriculture and Food for a period of up to three years. Support is provided to the schemes and management committees by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

From 1 July 2019, there will be vacancies on the following Management Committees:

NOTICE OF BAITING PROGRAM FOR WILD DOGS

The Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group advises that from January 1st 2019, heavy baiting programs (using 1080 meat baits) to control wild dogs will be carried out by Licensed Pest Management Technicians on Unallocated Crown Land to the east of the State Barrier Fence. In addition to 1080 baiting programs, technicians will be using foot hold traps treated with Strychnine to remove Wild Dogs that are currently impacting the livestock industry in the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group region.

From January 1st 2019, the standard wild dog control methods will be ongoing and this may include setting of traps and dispersing of 1080 meat baits in the groups operational area.

The poison baits will remain toxic for a number of months or until substantial rainfall is received. People are advised to take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Warning signs have been placed where applicable on Unallocated Crown Land and main access roads.

Picnic sites and recreational reserves are **not** included within the baiting program; however, baiting may take place adjacent to such areas and domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs.



Exercise caution to prevent your pets from being poisoned by 1080 baits.



If a wild dog is sighted, please report to the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group immediately.



If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre (phone 13 11 26).

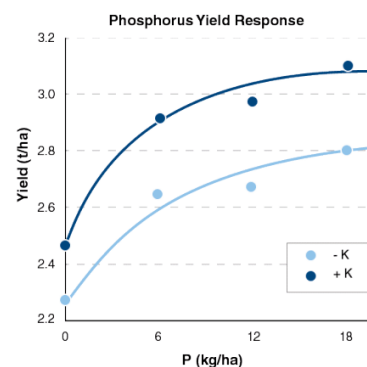
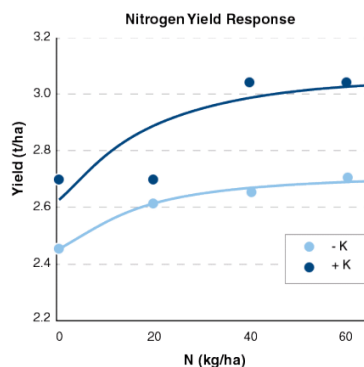

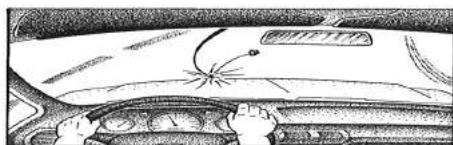
