BENDIGO BANK DECLINES PHYSICAL BANKING PRESENCE IN SOUTHERN CROSS

Following a very positive Public Meeting in Southern Cross on Wednesday, 31 October 2018 with Bendigo Bank personnel regarding the potential of Bendigo Bank establishing one of their Customer Service Centres in Southern Cross, the Shire of Yilgarn was recently advised that Bendigo Bank has now declined this offer.

Alex Dickson, Bendigo and Adelaide Bank Ltd's Regional Community Manager WA, advised Council in writing on 21 February 2019 of the following:-

"Thank you for your interest in establishing a presence of Bendigo Bank in the Shire of Yilgarn. As recently discussed on the telephone, at this point in time we are unable to start a campaign to establish a banking facility in the Shire of Yilgarn.

The campaign itself requires significant support and guidance from a partnering **Community Bank** branch and Bendigo Bank. Unfortunately, we do not presently have the resources to adequately support the establishment of a banking facility in your community.

We are also concerned that the remote location would considerably increase the establishment and ongoing operational costs, making the venture financially unviable.

Unfortunately, these factors combined make it very difficult to proceed with the campaign at the present time. We are hopeful that as our network develops in Western Australia, the situation will change and that in the future we will be better positioned to support your community with a physical banking presence.

While we cannot assist with establishing a physical presence, in todays 'Mobile Society' we are pleased to advise that our Mukinbudin **Community Bank** Branch and its Branch Manager, Tara Chambers, along with our Agri-Business Specialists are happy to discuss any banking inquiries to assist your community".

Council considered the above correspondence at its Ordinary meeting held on Thursday, 21 March 2019 and resolved the following:-

"That Council notes the decision of Bendigo Bank in declining to offer physical banking services in Southern Cross and that Council communicates Bendigo Bank's decision to the residents of the district via "Crosswords". In accepting Bendigo Bank's decision, Council acknowledges that the opportunities of acquiring a physical banking presence in Southern Cross is now extremely limited".





Influenza Vaccination Program for 2019

Annual vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications.

We have been advised by the Department of Health WA that government funded influenza vaccines should be available sometime in April.

Please note: optimal protection against influenza occurs within the first three to four months following vaccination. Timing of vaccination should aim to achieve the highest level of protection during peak influenza season, usually from June to September in most parts of Australia. Therefore, vaccinating from April/May provides protection before the peak season (Department of Health WA, March 2019).

Eligibility for government funded influenza vaccination will be advised in Crosswords and at the surgery once the vaccine is available.

Private influenza vaccinations:

We will be offering private flu vaccines for a small cost to those who do not meet the above criteria, and also for those companies who wish to have their employees vaccinated. Please contact the practice on 9049 1147 for appointment scheduling.

\$7 million available to support local environment projects for Western Australia Community groups have until June 10, 2019 to apply for grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$450,000 Community groups that protect and restore Western Australia's unique natural resources are encouraged to apply for a share of \$7 million in State Government grant funding.

Community Stewardship Grants for 2019-20 are now available through the State Natural Resource Management (NRM) program.

There are two different grant categories - small grants between \$1,000 and \$35,000, and large grants between \$35,001 and \$450,000.

These grants support projects that help care for a local natural area, conserve WA's biodiversity, improve sustainability in agriculture and build the capability of NRM community groups.

The grants are available to local landcare, farming and NRM community groups, schools and local governments.



Be aware of the signs of a stressed ceiling

Following a recent ceiling collapse at a Thornlie property, home owners are reminded to act promptly on warning signs of ceiling stress.

A ceiling collapse can cause serious injury to anyone present at the time of collapse and it can also cause extensive damage to a room's contents and structure.

Collapses may occur because of storm damage, water leaks, inappropriate use or access to roof space, inappropriate materials or loads, or poor workmanship.

About 10 ceiling collapses are reported to our colleagues at Building and Energy each year.

Prevention is far better than a cure in terms of the risks, costs and inconvenience associated with a ceiling collapse. Reinforcement and repairs will almost always be a more straightforward option compared to a full ceiling replacement. Knowing how to spot the telltale signs of a stressed ceiling and taking timely action is important.

Warning signs that a ceiling is failing may include a cracking sound in the ceiling, sagging or dropping of the plasterboard sheeting and/or the cornice, visual cracking and small circles or blisters (nail pops) in a line on the ceiling, which are a sign the plasterboard sheeting may be pulling away from the beam above it.

There are ceiling checks you can do or have someone else do. Measure the height of your ceiling where it meets the wall and then measure the ceiling height in the middle of the room. A variation in heights of 12 mm or more could indicate the plasterboard sheeting has detached from the ceiling joists. Place a straightedge or spirit level over an area of ceiling sheeting and see if there unevenness anywhere in your ceiling.

Check to see if there is a gap between the ceiling sheeting and the joists. This can only be done by accessing the ceiling space, which presents numerous hazards, so it is strongly recommended that you engage a suitably qualified person to do this. If you choose to enter your ceiling space make sure all power is isolated before doing so.

Good ceiling care can help prevent damage. Avoid accessing your ceiling space or storing items there – heavy loads can damage the ceiling framing or sheeting.

Roof leaks should be repaired and any moisture-damaged insulation or plasterboard should be replaced as quickly as possible.

Exhaust fans and air conditioning outlets should discharge to the outside, not into the ceiling space. If the warning signs of a ceiling under stress are present, action needs to be taken. Owners need to be proactive and arrange inspection and repair of the affected areas.

If you see signs of failure, contact the builder in the first instance. If you are not satisfied with the builder's response, you should consider engaging the services of a qualified building inspector to identify the nature or extent of any problems.



Pioneers of Pilgarn

Stage 1.

Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Pennyfather, Honora: Mrs Honora Pennyfather brought up a family of ten children on her own after her husband was killed by a train in 1905. The children were a credit to her and went on to be successful. One boy was killed at Gallipoli. Mrs Pennyfather worked at the local hospital as midwife for many years and brought into this world the next generation of Southern Crossites.

Praetz, Albert and Alice: Came to Southern Cross in 1892 and started a boarding house in Spica Street, afterwards taking on a livery stable in Altair Street. His brightly painted sulkies and wagons which he hired out were distinctive throughout the district. Mail contracts were a profitable sideline, as well as carting machinery for the mines. He also took up 160 acres of farming land which was later bought by Forrester.

When Albert died in 1909 at the young age of 42, his family carried on with the business. Later Mrs Praetz operated a tuckshop diagonally opposite the State School. She had endured eight stillborn babies, with three surviving children. Babies and father are buried in the local cemetery.

Prendegast, William: Father William Prendegast was the first catholic priest appointed to Southern Cross. He was tasked with getting his religion off the ground in a new goldfield, and would preach wherever he could command a crowd, including in the pubs. He was an outspoken individual who got things done, including erecting the first catholic church/school in Southern Cross.

Later the building was turned into a presbytery for Nuns. When an assistant was appointed to Southern Cross a few years later, Prendegast did the outlying areas in keeping with his pioneering spirit, where he caught pneumonia and died.
