

CONSTRUCTION OF NEW SOUTHERN CROSS SWIMMING POOL

Dear residents

The Shire of Yilgarn has been successful in applying for funding towards the cost of a new aquatic facility and received \$700,000 from the Department of Local Government, Sports and Cultural Industries through the "Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund".

Furthermore, Council has been allocating funds within a specific reserve account to meet the total project cost.

Tenders were invited for the design of the new facility and Council has awarded the tender to Donovan Payne Architects from Perth at the May Council meeting.

Due to funding and acquittal obligations, Council had to make the hard decision to forgo one season without a swimming pool, which means that there will be no swimming pool facility in 2019/20.

It is appreciated that this is inconvenient and will affect the community but unfortunately, this will be a necessary evil in order to construct a new facility.

The current swimming pool facility is 60 years old and beyond meaningful repair, as the bowl leaks large amounts of water, which is a great expense to Council and ratepayers.

Council is now working with the Architects on the design in order to accommodate all users of the facility.

A community consultation will commence shortly where Council will seek input regarding the design and functionalities of the future aquatic centre.

The building used for play group was demolished due to its age and state of disrepair.


A unisex accessible toilet will be erected in its place soon and a water fountain will be installed near the BBQ and rotunda.

It is considered to move the existing playground near Sirius Street, closer to the Rotunda, adding shade, seating and other new toddler friendly equipment, as below.





Pioneers of Pilgarn


Stage 1.
Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Roberts, Richard: Owner of the largest cordial factory in town. In 1900 he took up a miners homestead lease of 20 acres near the cemetery, and established the first farmlet at Southern Cross. (Now part of Beaton's property)

He ran poultry and grew market produce on a large scale. He was also licensee of the Club Hotel, which he kept supplied with produce grown on his farm.

His lawn was envied, at a time when lawns were few and far between. Roberts was also active in town affairs; secretary for newly formed rifle club, violin player in the town band, and auditor for the Municipality.

What's happening?

In Western Australia:

One person dies every day by suicide. That's more than the road toll. Nearly 3 out of 4 deaths by suicide are male.

WA's suicide rate was approx 20 per cent higher than the national average in 2016.

A big risk factor for suicide and self-harm is having a mental health issue.

We can reduce the risk of suicide by treating mental health issues early, by building resilience, and improving the overall mental health and wellbeing of Western Australians.


