Message from the Shire President



It gives me pleasure to present to the residents and ratepayers of the Shire of Yilgarn the 2019/2020 Budget that was adopted by Council at its Ordinary meeting held on Thursday, 15 August 2019.

The development of Council's Budget is not an easy task and every effort is made to continue to provide the services that our ratepayers and residents expect without increasing rates to an unacceptable level. I believe that Councillors and staff have again delivered a measurable and responsible Budget for the 2019/2020 financial year.

Rate increases in this Budget have been set well below the current CPI with Council applying an average 0.5% rate increase across all GRV and UV areas. As UV ratepayers would be now well aware, due to annual revaluations undertaken by Landgate, some ratepayers will receive an increase in their rates beyond the 0.5%, which is purely based on their valuations increasing accordingly. Unfortunately, Council has no control over the valuations set on properties but if ratepayers feel aggrieved with their valuations, they do have the right to appeal with appropriate information detailed on the Rate Notice.

Whilst continuing to provide the normal annual service provisions such as maintaining Council's buildings, road network, parks and gardens etc., the 2019/2020 Budget has a number of significant projects in the coming year which are detailed below:-

- \$4.3M redevelopment of the Southern Cross Swimming Pool. This will see a brand new facility to replace the existing 50 plus year infrastructure.
- \$60,000 for the implementation of a Rural Numbering System (RNS). The RNS is an initiative to improve emergency response times to rural properties that is strongly supported by WA Police, St. John Ambulance and Department of Fire and Emergency Services.
- \$28,000 for the installation of automatic doors and new cabinetry at the Southern Cross Medical Centre. The installation of automatic doors ensures that Council is meeting its Disability Services and Inclusion Plan objectives.
- \$80,000 for renovation works to 2 units and adjoining en-suite at the Southern Cross Caravan Park's Sandalwood Lodge.
- \$302,000 for Stage II of the asbestos roof removal at the Yilgarn Recreation Complex.
- \$106,000 for external wall repairs and installation of an Ambulant toilet at the Yilgarn History Museum.

- \$50,000 for purchase of new playground equipment at Constellation Park.
- \$28,000 for upgrading works to the Southern Cross and Marvel Loch Sewerage schemes.
- \$30,000 as a contribution to the Moorine Rock Tennis Club's synthetic tennis courts at a total cost of \$75,000.

The Shire of Yilgarn has always prided itself on its fleet of modern plant and equipment in order to maintain its vast network of roads and in the 2019/2020 Budget, \$923,500 has been allocated to purchase the following major pieces of plant with a trade-in value of \$266,000, giving a nett expenditure of \$672,000:-

- \$236,000 new Vibratory Steel Roller
- \$279,000 new 8 Wheel Truck
- \$115,000 new Skid Steer Loader

To allow for the ongoing replacement of plant and equipment, Council maintains a Plant Reserve Fund specifically for this purpose to ensure that there is minimal impact upon annual Budgets. A well managed 10 year Plant Replacement Program and Plant Reserve Fund ensures that Council is able to maintain such a modern fleet.

The 2019/2020 Budget that I now present to the community will be my last as I have made the decision not to re-contest my position as Councillor at the October 2019 Council Elections. It has been an absolute honour to serve the Yilgarn district as a Councillor and I feel even more privileged to have served as your Shire President for the past 6 years. I would like to thank my fellow Councillors and the senior management team, both past and present, for the support that they have given me over the years and I am positive that the Shire of Yilgarn will grow from strength to strength in the years to come.

Before closing, I sincerely thank Councillors and staff for the work and deliberations undertaken in the presentation of the 2019/2020 Budget and I would encourage residents and ratepayers to also take ownership of this document and approach Councillors and senior managers should clarification be required on any matters contained within this document.

The importance of the Find Cancer Early campaign shared at the CRC

Melissa Pickering Cancer Council WA Regional Education Officer—Wheatbelt visited the CRC to speak

about the Find Cancer Early campaign. The earlier cancer is found, the greater the chance of successful treatment, so it's vital you know what to look out for and see your doctor without delay when something's not right.

Sadly, sometimes a lack of understanding of cancer symptoms and delaying going to the doctor can lead to a poorer outcome when cancer is diagnosed. Unfortunately survival outcomes for regional Australians are 20 -30% worse than Australians living in a metropolitan area, however the *Find Cancer Early* campaign for regional WA aims to change that. The campaign urges people to talk to their doctor if they notice any unusual changes in their body.

If you experience any of the following for more than four weeks – new or changed spots on your skin; problems peeing; runny poo; unexplained

weight loss; any unusual pain, lump or swelling anywhere in your body; a persistent cough or breathlessness – get it checked out. Even more importantly, if you ever have blood in your pee or poo, or cough up blood, it's especially essential that you don't ignore it - see your doctor, clinic nurse, or Aboriginal health worker straight away. Go to www.findcancerearly.com.au to find out more about the campaign or if you need cancer information or support you can call Cancer Council WA on 131120.

Don't gift iTunes cards to scammers

If you don't know much about iTunes gift cards, that's music to scammers' ears. Fraudsters call out-of-the-blue pretending to be a representative of a government agency, such as the Australian Tax Office (ATO), or they might pose as a utility company – they say you owe money and make threats to scare you, claiming you can pay off the debt with iTunes cards.

You might have seen warning signs about these sorts of scams on the gift card stands / carousels at major retailers. Despite those signs and repeated media stories and community education initiatives, there are still many people falling victim to iTunes gift card scams.

We regularly hear of seniors or vulnerable members of the community buying thousands of dollars-worth of the cards from supermarkets because they're terrified of being arrested or deported, or worried their power, phone line or internet might be cut off.

In regional Western Australia a woman was recently convinced to buy \$8,000 worth of iTunes cards – the phone scammers said there was a warrant out for her arrest due unpaid tax debt and they even gave her directions to a supermarket where she could purchase the gift cards.

She found out it was a scam when she went to the police station, who referred her to the local Consumer Protection office.

Scammers behind these frauds are usually overseas and are very good at their job and use phone numbers that look like they're in Australia.

It's important to know no government agencies or utilities will ever make threatening cold calls and they never ever accept iTunes cards as a payment method.

If you or anyone you know gets a call like this put the phone down or if it's a voicemail that's been left, delete it. Never return the call. You can call WA ScamNet on **1300 30 40 54** to confirm a suspect call is a scam and that you are not in any trouble.

A way we can all fight back is to talk about this scam with relatives, neighbours and particularly people in our community who could be at risk, such as the elderly and new migrants.

If you work somewhere that sells iTunes gift cards and someone tries to buy thousands of dollars-worth in one transaction, talk to your manager or ask the customer to talk to Consumer Protection.

Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Biosecurity Funding Scheme

In June 2010, the Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (IFS) was introduced to address pest and disease issues relevant to the Western Australian grain, seed and hay industry.

The Scheme was established under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007* to enable growers to identify the pest and disease priorities at a whole-ofindustry level and raise funds to activities to address these priorities.

Funds are raised through grower contributions that are collected by registered receivers¹. Growers do not have to participate in the Scheme — there is a mechanism that allows them to opt out. Opting out does not remove the legal requirement to deal with the pests and diseases to which the Scheme relates, but does disqualify the grower from any benefits provided by the Scheme such as on-ground assistance to control the pest or disease and compensation.

The Grains, Seeds and Hay IFS is overseen by a seven-member Industry Management Committee, appointed by the Minister for Agriculture and Food. As required by regulation, the majority of the Management Committee are full participants of the Scheme.

The Management Committee is responsible for approving payments made from the IFS Account and the biosecurity-related programs funded through the Scheme. They also provide advice to the Minister on the Scheme's area of operation and the contribution rate.

2019/20 Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry funding Scheme

For the 2019/20 financial year, a contribution of 25 cents per tonne will apply to the first sale of grain and seed produced in the agricultural area² of Western Australia.; and a contribution of 12.5 cents per tonne will apply to the first sale of hay produced in the agricultural area² of Western Australia.

The money raised will fund programs to control skeleton weed and eradicate three-horned bedstraw.

Managing biosecurity threats requires a collaborative effort. The Scheme is industry working together to address the priority issues that can impact on the future of the WA grains, seeds and hay industry.

The Grains, Seeds and Hay IFS Management Committee welcomes industry input to and feedback on the Scheme. The Management Committee is committed to ensuring the Scheme is addressing the industry's priorities efficiently and effectively.

Changes to the Scheme

- The 'first and last mile' special RAV access arrangements have been finalised.
- HMMS will continue, however will revert to its original intent as a mass management scheme.



Access Update

- 1053 roads were endorsed under HMMS Road Lists for the 2018-19 harvest period.
- Onsite assessments are underway with the intent to add these endorsed roads to the relevant RAV Networks prior to the upcoming harvest period.
- This eliminates the need for future special access arrangements under HMMS.



Key Points

- No changes to the HMMS mass provisions.
- Apply for new RAV access early, allowing up to 12 weeks.
- HMMS access is now via RAV Networks or Restricted Local Access Permits.

Harvest Mass Management Scheme

What you need to know for 2019-2020 Harvest Period



Register for HMMS

- If you wish to participate in HMMS, continue to register your vehicles with a participating Grain Receiver.
- Familiarise yourself with the HMMS Business Rules, available on the Harvest Mass Management Scheme page of our website.
- DO NOT submit a HMMS Road List to Main Roads.



New RAV Access

 If there are additional roads you need, for an upcoming harvest period, which are not approved for RAV access and you did not apply for them under HMMS last season, you will need to apply to Main Roads to have the roads assessed via the standard RAV application process.



RAV Access Options

- Use a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination that is 20 m or less in length and 50 t or less in gross mass on any road.
- Use a RAV that is greater than a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination on approved RAV Network roads.

Harvest Mass Management Scheme 4 Step Guide

Follow these four steps to ensure you are ready for the 2019-20 HMMS harvest period:

Confirm RAV Network

 Transport operators and farmers needs to ensure all roads they use are approved for the particular RAV combination being used. This information is available on the RAV Mapping Tool. Roads endorsed under a HMMS Road List in 2018-19 will be approved if they meet the minimum safety standards. If the roads requested do not meet the minimum standards, the applicant will be contacted by Main Roads and advised accordingly.

New RAV Access is Required

• If additional roads are required, the transport operator or farmer needs to apply for new RAV access via the standard RAV application process. DO NOT submit a HMMS Road List to Main Roads. Further information and application form is available on the Road Access page of our website.

Register for HMMS

• The transport operator must register their vehicles with a registered Grain Receiver. They should also familiairise themselves with the Business Rules available on the Harvest Mass Management Scheme page of our website.

Commence Operating

 Once the roads you require are all approved for the relevant RAV combination being used, your vehicles are registered with a Grain Receiver, and you are familiar with the Business Rules, you are ready to start carting for the harvest season.


Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Sprunt, Gordon: Came to Southern Cross during the mid-1890's. He worked on the railways before starting a newsagency business in Railway Town with his wife.

Later, they moved the business to lot 38 in the main street to get better exposure. The business was expanded by including a mail run and taxi service to Marvel Loch and Parkers Range. Sprunt used a T model Ford motor vehicle on the mail run.

Their eldest son was killed during the first war which triggered both parents to take a leading role in soldier welfare at Southern Cross. Both were recognised for community work. Sprunt served as member of Yilgarn Road Board before retiring to Perth.


