We are currently looking into amending the name of this volunteer group, due to the change of it's role since inception over 30 years ago.

Also for State Events in Perth we have been able to support the JUNIOR FIRIES when they go. These are 2 areas we have been involved with for several years and provided opportunities for many young to take place in positive experiences not available to them here.



It is our intention to operate the DRIVER REVIVER VAN over the Christmas break. So once again we will be relying on some of you to volunteer your help during this time to provide a very worth while service to the motor public using Great Eastern Highway. The van has been operated by us with the assistance of the Shire for many years at Easter and Christmas and the support from everyone when asked for help is always exceptional.

This committee were very happy to be able to support the hard working YILGARN MOTORING ENTHUSIASTS this year, and congratulate them on a job very well done on September 29. In previous times we have added our support to the Ladies Health Day, a First Aid Course and a visit from Constable Care, both initiated by the local Police, a Bush Fire Appeal function organised by the Volunteer Fire Brigade and for many years organised and ran a Youth Camp, sometimes to Harvey and sometimes to Albany

We hope this gives a broad picture of our role and our aim to provide opportunities not covered by other organisations or primary health service providers, and encourage anyone who is interested to come along to our AGM and learn more.




We try and go away on the long weekends because it gives us three/four days away, in the bush doing what we love to do – rejuvenate the spirit, chill out, sleep really well.

Pioneers of Pilgarn


Stage 1. Citizens who built this district between years 1887 and 1914

Thompson, Frederick: Worked on Sayers mine about five miles south of Southern Cross during 1888, and was killed by an explosion of dynamite. Safety features in the mining industry were non-existent in those days. Fred has the distinction of being the first inmate in pioneer cemetery.

Thorn, William: Came to Southern Cross in the early 1890's as an auctioneer. In 1892 he was appointed first Town Clerk of the Municipality. He was also secretary to the Yilgarn Road Board, with both governing bodies made up of mostly the same men. This wasteful duplication went on until 1918 when the two were amalgamated. Thorn was responsible for getting both institutions off the ground. Rates and other income was insufficient to get the job done, and government grants was the main source. Thorne became disillusioned and left in 1894 to get into the flour milling industry where he was highly successful.

Tindale, William: Owner and publisher of Southern Cross Miner newspaper around 1900. Papers were important means to reach the people, Tindale's articles bringing attention to shortcomings in the community and helped build a better town. His journalistic style was refreshing to read. Unfortunately Tindale was driven broke by rival newspaper Southern Cross Times which was owned by moneyed people more intent on being heard than helping. The town was not big enough to support two newspapers.

Kicking goals for Country Sport

Local Sporting Champions is a Morrison Government program that provides grants to children aged 12-18 who are attending eligible state, national or international championships.
