**SURVEY RESULTS** 

#### 40 surveys were returned as at deadline of 5 pm, 6th September 2019.

400 paper surveys were printed and delivered via unaddressed mail, survey news was published in Crosswords twice, and available online through SurveyMonkey (linked from Shire's webpage).

13 surveys were completed online using SurveyMonkey and 27 paper surveys were returned to the Shire Administration Office by return mail or hand delivered into the survey box.



Kids need to be able to finish high school here, as we are sending them a message from the age of 13/14 that their town is so unimportant they don't have a proper schoolbecause once they go to Perth they don't want to come back to take over the family farm or even play on the footy team.


